A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to a trauma-informed care policy for school districts and 3 open-enrollment charter schools and training regarding the policy 4 for district and school employees.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Section 11.252(a), Education Code, is amended to
read as follows:

(a) Each school district shall have a district improvement 8 9 plan that is developed, evaluated, and revised annually, in accordance with district policy, by the superintendent with the 10 assistance of the district-level committee established under 11 12 Section 11.251. The purpose of the district improvement plan is to guide district and campus staff in the improvement of student 13 performance for all student groups in order to attain state 14 standards in respect to the achievement indicators adopted under 15 16 Section 39.053(c). The district improvement plan must include 17 provisions for:

(1) 18 а comprehensive needs assessment addressing 19 district student performance on the achievement indicators, and other appropriate measures of performance, that are disaggregated 20 by all student groups served by the district, including categories 21 22 of ethnicity, socioeconomic status, sex, and populations served by 23 special programs, including students in special education programs 24 under Subchapter A, Chapter 29;

(2) measurable district performance objectives for 1 appropriate achievement indicators for all 2 all student 3 populations, including students in special education programs under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, and other measures of student 4 5 performance that may be identified through the comprehensive needs assessment; 6

7 (3) strategies for improvement of student performance8 that include:

9 (A) instructional methods for addressing the 10 needs of student groups not achieving their full potential;

(B) methods for addressing the needs of studentsfor special programs, including:

(i) suicide prevention programs, in
 accordance with Subchapter O-1, Chapter 161, Health and Safety
 Code, which includes a parental or guardian notification procedure;

SECTION 2. Sections 21.054(d) and (d-2), Education Code, 27

1 are amended to read as follows:

2 (d) Continuing education requirements for a classroom 3 teacher must provide that not more than 25 percent of the training 4 required every five years include instruction regarding:

5 (1) collecting and analyzing information that will6 improve effectiveness in the classroom;

7 (2) recognizing early warning indicators that a8 student may be at risk of dropping out of school;

9 (3) digital learning, digital teaching, and 10 integrating technology into classroom instruction;

11 (4) educating diverse student populations, including: 12 (A) students with disabilities, including mental 13 health disorders;

14 (B) students who educationally are 15 disadvantaged; 16 (C) students of limited English proficiency; and 17 (D) students at risk of dropping out of school; [and] 18

19 (5) understanding appropriate relationships, 20 boundaries, and communications between educators and students<u>;</u> 21 <u>and</u>[+]

22 (6) [(d-2) Continuing education requirements for a 23 classroom teacher may include instruction regarding] how grief and 24 trauma affect student learning and behavior and how evidence-based, 25 grief-informed, and trauma-informed strategies support the 26 academic success of students affected by grief and trauma.

27 (d-2) The instruction required under Subsection (d)(6) must

Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is 5 6 amended by adding Section 38.036 to read as follows: 7 Sec. 38.036. TRAUMA-INFORMED CARE POLICY. (a) Each school district and open-enrollment charter school shall adopt and 8 implement a policy requiring the integration of trauma-informed 9 practices in each school environment. 10 (b) A policy required by this section must address: 11 12 (1) using resources developed by the agency, methods 13 for: 14 (A) increasing staff and parent awareness of 15 trauma-informed care; and 16 (B) implementation of trauma-informed practices and care by district and campus staff; and 17 (2) available counseling options for students 18 19 affected by trauma or toxic stress. (c) The methods under Subsection (b)(1) for increasing 20 21 awareness and implementation of trauma-informed care must include training as provided by this subsection. The training: 22 23 (1) must be provided: 24 (A) through _____ an ____evidence-based, evidence-informed, or promising practices training program that 25 26 addresses the effects of trauma and is approved by the agency; and (B) as part of any new employee orientation for 27

1 <u>all new school district and open-enrollment charter school</u> 2 <u>educators or coaches; and</u>

3 (2) may be provided to existing school district and 4 open-enrollment charter school educators or coaches on a schedule 5 recommended by commissioner rule.

6 (d) For any training provided under Subsection (c), each 7 school district and open-enrollment charter school shall maintain 8 records that include the name of each district or charter school 9 staff member who participated in the training.

10 <u>(e) If a school district or open-enrollment charter school</u> 11 <u>determines that the district or charter school does not have</u> 12 <u>sufficient resources to provide the training required under</u> 13 <u>Subsection (c), the district or charter school shall make</u> 14 <u>reasonable efforts to collaborate with a community organization to</u> 15 <u>provide training that meets the requirements of Subsection (c) at</u> 16 <u>no cost to the district or charter school.</u>

17 (f) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to 18 administer this section.

SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020 school year.

21 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
