- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 42.025, Human Resources
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 42.025. SEARCHABLE DATABASE OF PREVIOUSLY DISCIPLINED
- 8 FAMILY HOMES.

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- 9 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 42, Human Resources Code,
- 10 is amended by adding Section 42.026 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 42.026. INTERNET WEBSITE LISTING DAY-CARE PROVIDERS.
- 12 (a) The commission shall maintain a single, statewide Internet
- 13 website of day-care providers, including day-care centers, group
- 14 day-care homes, listed and registered family homes, and
- 15 prekindergarten programs provided by public school districts or
- 16 charter schools under Chapter 29, Education Code.
- 17 (b) The Internet website must:
- 18 <u>(1) be user-friendly, easy to navigate, and designed to</u>
- 19 assist parents in locating and selecting day-care providers;
- 20 (2) be searchable by the information provided under
- 21 <u>Subdivision (5)(D);</u>
- 22 (3) provide resources for parents regarding early
- 23 childhood education and development, including information or
- 24 materials developed under Section 2308.317(a)(5), Government Code;

1	(4) be easily accessible by:								
2	(A) persons who speak a language other than								
3	English; and								
4	(B) persons and families of persons with a								
5	disability; and								
6	(5) include:								
7	(A) information to assist families in								
8	understanding the importance of licensed day-care facilities;								
9	(B) an annual report compiled by the commission								
10	on the number of deaths, serious injuries, and incidents of child								
11	abuse and neglect that have occurred in day-care facilities;								
12	(C) contact information for state and local								
13	agencies that can provide additional assistance to parents and								
14	individuals with questions about day-care facilities;								
15	(D) the following information for each day-care								
16	<pre>provider:</pre>								
17	(i) the provider's address and zip code;								
18	(ii) whether the provider is licensed,								
19	listed, or registered;								
20	(iii) the provider's hours of operation;								
21	(iv) the setting of the day-care provider;								
22	(v) the ages of children served by the								
23	provider;								
24	(vi) whether the provider participates in								
25	the Texas Workforce Commission's child care subsidy program;								
26	(vii) the provider's Texas Rising Star								
27	Program rating provided by the Texas Workforce Commission.								

- 1 (viii) the provider's status as an Early
- 2 Head Start or Head Start provider as provided by the Texas Head
- 3 Start State Collaboration Office; and
- 4 (ix) a link to each inspection report for
- 5 the provider posted on the commission's Internet website; and
- 6 (E) an optional profile for each day-care
- 7 provider, developed in collaboration with the provider, that
- 8 <u>includes a brief narrative about the provider, information about</u>
- 9 the provider's services, and photographs.
- 10 <u>(c) The commission shall consult with the Texas Early</u>
- 11 Learning Council in developing the Internet website required by
- 12 this section.
- 13 (d) The commission shall make the Internet website
- 14 available through a mobile application for wireless communication
- 15 <u>devices.</u>
- 16 (e) The commission may contract with a third party to
- 17 establish the Internet website and mobile application for wireless
- 18 communication devices required under this section.
- 19 SECTION 3. Not later than January 1, 2020, the Health and
- 20 Human Services Commission shall make the Internet website required
- 21 by Section 42.026, Human Resources Code, as added by this Act,
- 22 available to the public.
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
