- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 355.102(b), Estates Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 (b) Class 1 claims are composed of funeral expenses and
- 8 expenses of the decedent's last illness, including claims for the
- 9 cost of electrical service provided to the decedent if the decedent
- 10 had been designated as a critical care residential customer, for a
- 11 reasonable amount approved by the court, not to exceed a total of
- 12 \$15,000. Any excess shall be classified and paid as other unsecured
- 13 claims.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 355.103, Estates Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 355.103. PRIORITY OF CERTAIN PAYMENTS. When a
- 17 personal representative has estate funds in the representative's
- 18 possession, the representative shall pay in the following order:
- 19 (1) funeral expenses and expenses of the decedent's
- 20 last illness, including claims for the cost of electrical service
- 21 provided to the decedent if the decedent had been designated as a
- 22 <u>critical care residential customer</u>, in an amount not to exceed
- 23 \$15,000;
- 24 (2) allowances made to the decedent's surviving spouse

- 1 and children, or to either the surviving spouse or children;
- 2 (3) expenses of administration and expenses incurred
- 3 in preserving, safekeeping, and managing the estate; and
- 4 (4) other claims against the estate in the order of the
- 5 claims' classifications.
- 6 SECTION 3. Sections 355.102(b) and 355.103, Estates Code,
- 7 as amended by this Act, apply only to the estate of a decedent who
- 8 dies on or after the effective date of this Act. The estate of a
- 9 decedent who dies before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 10 by the law in effect on the date of the decedent's death, and the
- 11 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
