2	relating to mental health assessment programs for certain municipal
3	police and fire departments.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 142, Local Government
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 142.015 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 142.015. MENTAL HEALTH ASSESSMENT PROGRAM FOR POLICE
8	AND FIRE DEPARTMENTS IN CERTAIN MUNICIPALITIES. (a) In this
9	section, "program" means a mental health assessment program
10	established under this section.
11	(b) This section applies only to a municipality with a
12	population of two million or more.
13	(c) Each municipal police and fire department shall
14	establish and operate a mental health assessment program in
15	accordance with this section to provide a mental health assessment
16	for police officers or firefighters involved in a critical
17	incident.
18	(d) A municipal police or fire department shall require a
19	police officer or firefighter involved in a critical incident to
20	participate in the program and receive a mental health assessment
21	in accordance with this section not later than the 10th day after
22	the date of the critical incident. The department shall adopt a
23	written policy defining a critical incident that includes:
24	(1) the discharge of a weapon that results in the death

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1 or serious injury of an individual; and 2 (2) witnessing the death or serious injury of a police 3 officer or firefighter while in the line of duty. 4 (e) The program must provide a mental health assessment that 5 is: 6 (1) conducted by a licensed psychologist, licensed master social worker, or another licensed mental health care 7 8 professional determined appropriate by the municipal police or fire department; and 9 10 (2) evidence-based and includes a suicidal ideation evaluation. 11 12 (f) A municipal police or fire department may not terminate or retaliate against a police officer or firefighter for 13 participating in the program. 14 15 (g) A mental health assessment provided under the program is confidential in accordance with Section 611.002, Health and Safety 16 17 Code. A municipal police or fire department shall adopt a written policy that ensures <u>a disclosure</u> authorized by Section 18 19 611.004(a)(2), Health and Safety Code, does not result in the termination of or retaliation against the police officer or 20 firefighter who is the subject of the disclosure. A mental health 21 professional conducting the mental health assessment may notify the 22 department of a scheduled assessment and the completion of the 23 24 assessment for purposes of ensuring program participation. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 25 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
