   (a) The commission may retain any consultant, accountant, auditor,
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   engineer, or attorney the commission considers necessary to
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   represent the commission in a proceeding before a regional
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   transmission organization, or before a court reviewing proceedings
   of a regional transmission organization, related to:
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               (1) the relationship of an electric utility to a power
   region, regional transmission organization, or independent system
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   operator;
               (2) the approval of an agreement among an electric
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   utility and the electric utility's affiliates concerning the
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   coordination of the operations of the electric utility and the

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               (3) other matters related to an electric utility that
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   may affect the ultimate rates paid by retail customers in this
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   state.
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(b) Notwithstanding Sections 39.402(a), 39.452(d), and

- 3 (c) Assistance for which a consultant, accountant, auditor,
- 4 engineer, or attorney may be retained under Subsection (a) may
- 5 include:

- 7 (2) conducting an investigation;
- 8 (3) presenting evidence;

- 10 <u>(5) representing the commission.</u>
- 11 (d) The electric utility that is the subject of the
- 12 proceeding shall pay timely the reasonable costs of the services of
- 13 a person retained under Subsection (a), as determined by the
