4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 2.007, Family Code, is amended to read as
6	follows:
7	Sec. 2.007. AFFIDAVIT OF ABSENT APPLICANT. (a) The
8	affidavit of an absent applicant must include:
9	(1) the absent applicant's full name, including the
10	maiden surname of a female applicant, address, date of birth, place
11	of birth, including city, county, and state, citizenship, and
12	social security number, if any;

- 13 (2) a declaration that the absent applicant has not
- 14 been divorced within the last 30 days;
- 15 (3) a declaration that the absent applicant is:
- 16 (A) not presently married; or
- 17 (B) married to the other applicant and they wish
- 18 to marry again;
- 19 (4) a declaration that the other applicant is not
- 20 presently married and is not related to the absent applicant as:
- 21 (A) an ancestor or descendant, by blood or
- 22 adoption;
- 23 (B) a brother or sister, of the whole or half
- 24 blood or by adoption;

1 a parent's brother or sister, of the whole or 2 half blood or by adoption; a son or daughter of a brother or sister, of 3 the whole or half blood or by adoption; 4 5 (E) a current or former stepchild or stepparent; 6 or a son or daughter of a parent's brother or 7 (F) 8 sister, of the whole or half blood or by adoption; 9 a declaration that the absent applicant desires to marry and the name, age, and address of the person to whom the 10 absent applicant desires to be married; 11 12 the approximate date on which the marriage is to 13 occur; and 14 the reason the absent applicant is unable to 15 appear personally before the county clerk for the issuance of the license[; and 16 17 [(8) the appointment of any adult, other than the other applicant, to act as proxy for the purpose of participating in 18 the ceremony, if the absent applicant is: 19 [(A) a member of the armed forces of the United 20 21 States stationed in another country in support of combat or another military operation; and 22 [(B) unable to attend the ceremony]. 23 24 (b) In addition to the requirements of Subsection (a), an

absent applicant who is a member of the armed forces of the United

States stationed in another country in support of combat or another

military operation who is unable to attend the marriage ceremony

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- 1 authorized under Section 2.203 shall include in the applicant's
- 2 affidavit:
- 3 (1) the appointment of any adult, other than the other
- 4 applicant, to act as proxy for the purpose of participating in the
- 5 ceremony; or
- 6 (2) a statement indicating that the applicant intends
- 7 to participate in the ceremony through the use of video conference
- 8 technology.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 2.203(b), Family Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 (b) A person <u>described by Section 2.007(b)</u> may:
- 12 (1) assent to marriage by the appearance of the $\left[\frac{a}{a}\right]$
- 13 proxy appointed in the affidavit authorized by Subchapter A; or
- (2) participate in the ceremony through the use of
- 15 <u>video conference technology</u> [if the person is:
- 16 [(1) a member of the armed forces of the United States
- 17 stationed in another country in support of combat or another
- 18 military operation; and
- [(2) unable to attend the ceremony].
- SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 27, Government Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Section 27.062 to read as follows:
- Sec. 27.062. VIDEO CONFERENCE TECHNOLOGY. For purposes of
- 23 Section 2.203(b), Family Code, an office of the justice of the peace
- 24 must provide video conference technology described by that section.
- 25 The technology must provide simultaneous, compressed full motion
- 26 video and interactive communication of image and sound between the
- 27 judge and the persons assenting to marriage.

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1 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
