H.B. No. 3881

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the use of epinephrine auto-injectors in primary and 3 secondary schools. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 38.208(c), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (c) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission, [in consultation with the commissioner of 8 9 education, and] with advice from the advisory committee, shall adopt rules regarding the maintenance, administration, 10 and disposal of an epinephrine auto-injector at a school campus subject 11 12 to a policy adopted under Subsection (a). The rules must establish: 13 14 (1) the number of epinephrine auto-injectors available at each campus; 15 16 (2) the process for each school district, open-enrollment charter school, and private school to check the 17 inventory of epinephrine auto-injectors at regular intervals for 18 expiration and replacement; and 19 20 (3) the amount of training required for school personnel and school volunteers to administer an epinephrine 21 22 auto-injector. SECTION 2. Section 38.209, Education Code, is amended to 23 24 read as follows:

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38.209. REPORT 1 Sec. ON ADMINISTERING EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTOR. (a) Not later than the 10th business day after the 2 date a school personnel member or school volunteer administers an 3 epinephrine auto-injector in accordance with a policy adopted under 4 5 Section 38.208(a), the school shall report the information required under Subsection (b) to: 6

7 (1) the school district, the charter holder if the
8 school is an open-enrollment charter school, or the governing body
9 of the school if the school is a private school;

10 (2) the physician or other person who prescribed the
11 epinephrine auto-injector; and

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(3) [the commissioner of education; and

[(4)] the commissioner of state health services.

14 (b) The report required under this section must include the 15 following information:

16 (1) the age of the person who received the 17 administration of the epinephrine auto-injector;

18 (2) whether the person who received the administration
19 of the epinephrine auto-injector was a student, a school personnel
20 member or school volunteer, or a visitor;

21 (3) the physical location where the epinephrine 22 auto-injector was administered;

23 (4) the number of doses of epinephrine auto-injector24 administered;

(5) the title of the person who administered the26 epinephrine auto-injector; and

27 (6) any other information required by the commissioner

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1 of <u>state health services</u> [education].

2 SECTION 3. Section 38.214, Education Code, is amended to 3 read as follows:

Sec. 38.214. RULES. <u>The</u> [Except as otherwise provided by
this subchapter, the commissioner of education and the] executive
commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
[jointly] adopt rules necessary to implement this subchapter.

8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
