A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to dissemination of bacterial meningitis information by
- 3 school districts.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 38.0025(a) and (c), Education Code, are
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The <u>Department of State Health Services</u> [agency] shall
- 8 prescribe procedures by which each school district shall provide
- 9 information relating to bacterial meningitis to its students and
- 10 their parents each school year. The procedures must ensure that the
- 11 information is reasonably likely to come to the attention of the
- 12 parents of each student. The <u>department</u> [agency] shall prescribe
- 13 the form and content of the information. The information must
- 14 cover:
- 15 (1) the symptoms of the disease, how it may be
- 16 diagnosed, and its possible consequences if untreated;
- 17 (2) how the disease is transmitted, how it may be
- 18 prevented, and the relative risk of contracting the disease for
- 19 primary and secondary school students;
- 20 (3) the availability and effectiveness of vaccination
- 21 against and treatment for the disease, and a brief description of
- 22 the risks and possible side effects of vaccination; and
- 23 (4) sources of additional information regarding the
- 24 disease, including any appropriate office of the school district

- 1 and the appropriate office of the $\underline{\text{department}}$ [$\underline{\text{Texas Department of}}$
- 2 Health].
- 3 (c) A school district, with the written consent of the
- 4 Department of State Health Services [agency], may provide the
- 5 information required by this section to its students and their
- 6 parents by a method different from the method prescribed by the
- 7 department [agency] under Subsection (a) if the department [agency]
- 8 determines that method would be effective in bringing the
- 9 information to the attention of the parents of each student.
- SECTION 2. Section 38.0025(b), Education Code, is repealed.
- SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020
- 12 school year.
- 13 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 14 of this Act, the Department of State Health Services shall develop
- 15 the procedures under Section 38.0025, Education Code, as amended by
- 16 this Act.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
