## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the administration of assessment instruments used to 3 assess the performance of public school students.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsections (a-12), (a-13), (b-1), (c), and (c-3) and 7 adding Subsections (a-14) and (c-7) to read as follows:

8 (a-12) An assessment instrument adopted or developed under9 Subsection (a) must be designed so that:

10 (1) if administered to students in grades three 11 through five, 85 percent of students will be able to complete <u>all</u> 12 [the] assessment <u>instruments for that grade</u> [<del>instrument</del>] within <u>an</u> 13 <u>aggregate period equal to the number of assessment instruments for</u> 14 that grade multiplied by 120 minutes; and

(2) if administered to students in grades six through
eight, 85 percent of students will be able to complete <u>all</u> [the]
assessment <u>instruments for that grade</u> [instrument] within <u>an</u>
aggregate period equal to the number of assessment instruments for
that grade multiplied by 180 minutes.

20 (a-13) The amount of time allowed for administration of an 21 assessment instrument adopted or developed under Subsection (a) may 22 not exceed eight hours, and the administration may occur <u>in</u> 23 <u>multiple parts over more than</u> [<del>on only</del>] one day.

24 (a-14) Subsections (a-12) and (a-13) do not apply to a

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classroom portfolio method used to assess writing performance.

2 (b-1) The agency, in conjunction with appropriate interested persons, shall redevelop assessment instruments adopted 3 developed under Subsection (b) for administration 4 or  $t \circ$ 5 significantly cognitively disabled students in a manner consistent with federal law. An assessment instrument under this subsection 6 may not require a teacher to prepare tasks or materials for a 7 8 student who will be administered such an assessment instrument. A classroom portfolio method used to assess writing performance may 9 require a teacher to prepare tasks and materials [Assessment 10 instruments adopted or developed under this subsection shall be 11 administered not later than the 2014-2015 school year]. 12

The agency shall also adopt end-of-course assessment 13 (c) 14 instruments for secondary-level courses in Algebra I, biology, 15 English I, English II, and United States history. The Algebra I end-of-course assessment instrument must be administered with the 16 17 aid of technology. The English I and English II end-of-course assessment instruments must each assess essential knowledge and 18 skills in both reading and writing [in the same assessment 19 instrument] and must provide a single score. A school district 20 shall comply with State Board of Education rules regarding 21 22 administration of the assessment instruments listed in this subsection. If a student is in a special education program under 23 24 Subchapter A, Chapter 29, the student's admission, review, and 25 dismissal committee shall determine whether any allowable modification is necessary in administering to the student an 26 assessment instrument required under this subsection. The State 27

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Board of Education shall administer the assessment instruments. <u>An</u>
<u>end-of-course assessment instrument may be administered in</u>
<u>multiple parts over more than one day</u> [The State Board of Education
shall adopt a schedule for the administration of end-of-course
<u>assessment instruments that complies with the requirements of</u>
<u>Subsection (c-3)</u>].

7 (c-3) <u>Except as provided by Subsection (c-7), in</u> [<del>In</del>] 8 adopting a schedule for the administration of assessment 9 instruments under this section, the State Board of Education shall 10 require:

(1) assessment instruments administered under Subsection (a) to be administered on a schedule so that the first assessment instrument is administered at least two weeks later than the date on which the first assessment instrument was administered under Subsection (a) during the 2006-2007 school year; and

16 (2) the spring administration of end-of-course 17 assessment instruments under Subsection (c) to occur in each school 18 district not earlier than the first full week in May, except that 19 the spring administration of the end-of-course assessment 20 instruments in English I and English II must be permitted to occur 21 at an earlier date.

22 (c-7) Subsection (c-3) does not apply to a classroom
23 portfolio method used to assess writing performance if student
24 performance under that method is less than 50 percent of a student's
25 overall assessed performance in writing.

26 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 27 of this Act, the commissioner of education shall adopt rules

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1 necessary to implement the changes in law made by this Act.

2 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020 3 school year.

4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
