2	relating to a dog's restraint and shelter.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter D, Chapter 821, Health
5	and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER D. [UNLAWFUL] RESTRAINT OF AND SHELTER FOR DOG
7	SECTION 2. Section 821.076, Health and Safety Code, is
8	amended by amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivision (1-a) to
9	read as follows:
10	(1) "Adequate shelter" means a sturdy structure that:
11	(A) allows the dog protection from the rain,
12	hail, sleet, snow, and subfreezing temperatures; and
13	(B) allows the dog while in the shelter to stand
14	erect, sit, turn around, and lie down in a normal position.
15	(1-a) "Collar" means any collar constructed of nylon,
16	leather, or similar material, specifically designed to be used for
17	a dog.
18	SECTION 3. Section 821.077, Health and Safety Code, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	Sec. 821.077. [UNLAWFUL] RESTRAINT OF AND SHELTER FOR DOG.
21	(a) An owner may not leave a dog outside and unattended by use of a
22	restraint that unreasonably limits the dog's movement [\div
23	(1) between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.;
24	[(2) within 500 feet of the premises of a school; or

- 4 SECTION 5. Section 821.079(c), Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (c) Except as otherwise provided by this section, an [A
- 7 person commits an offense if the person is provided a statement
- 8 described by Subsection (b) and fails to comply with this
- 9 subchapter within 24 hours of the time the owner is provided the
- 10 statement. An] offense under this section [subsection] is a Class C
- 11 misdemeanor.
- 12 SECTION 6. Section 821.079(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 13 repealed.
- 14 SECTION 7. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 15 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 16 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 17 governed by the law as it existed on the date the offense was
- 18 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 19 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed
- 20 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 21 occurred before that date.
- 22 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
