A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the donation and distribution of food at public
- 3 schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 33.907, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (b), (c) and (d) and adding Subsection (b-1)
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (b) A school district or open-enrollment charter school may
- 9 allow a campus to elect to donate food to a nonprofit organization
- 10 through:
- 11 (1) a parent of a student enrolled at the campus; or
- 12 <u>(2) a person [an official of the nonprofit</u>
- 13 organization] who is directly and officially affiliated with the
- 14 campus, including a teacher or $[\tau]$ counselor $[\tau]$
- 15 student enrolled at the campus].
- 16 (b-1) The donated food may be received, stored, and
- 17 distributed on the campus. Food donated by the campus may include:
- 18 (1) surplus food prepared for breakfast, lunch,
- 19 <u>snacks</u>, or dinner meals [or a snack to be] served <u>from</u> [at] the
- 20 campus cafeteria, subject to any applicable local, state, and
- 21 federal requirements; or
- (2) food donated to the campus as the result of a food
- 23 drive or similar event.
- (c) The type of food donated under Subsection (b-1)(1) [this

- 1 section] may include:
- 2 (1) [packaged or unpackaged] unserved food that was
- 3 packaged by a person on campus and that was never removed from the
- 4 campus food serving area before the food is donated;
- 5 (2) packaged served food if the packaging and food are
- 6 [is] in good condition and the temperature of the food has been
- 7 maintained as required by law;
- 8 (3) whole, uncut produce; and
- 9 (4) unserved wrapped raw produce the temperature of
- 10 which has been maintained as required by law[; and
- 11 (5) unpeeled fruit required to be peeled before
- 12 consumption].
- 13 (d) Food donated under this section to a nonprofit
- 14 organization may be distributed at the campus at any time. Campus
- 15 employees may assist in preparing and distributing the food as
- 16 volunteers for the nonprofit organization. A person who assists in
- 17 preparing and distributing the food as a volunteer for the
- 18 nonprofit organization must be trained under Subchapter D, Chapter
- 19 438, Health and Safety Code or supervised by a person who has been
- 20 trained under that law.
- 21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
