A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. STUDY OF IMPACT OF FEDERAL EDUCATIONAL MANDATES
- 6 ON SCHOOL DISTRICTS. (a) In this section, "federal educational
- 7 mandate" means a federal statutory provision or a rule or
- 8 regulation adopted under that provision the implementation of which
- 9 requires an expenditure by a school district that would not have
- 10 been required in the absence of the statutory provision or the rule
- 11 or regulation adopted under that provision.
- 12 (b) The Legislative Budget Board, in coordination with the
- 13 Texas Education Agency, shall conduct a study regarding the effect
- 14 of federal educational mandates on school districts. The study
- 15 must include:
- 16 (1) a cost-benefit analysis on the impact of school
- 17 district compliance with federal educational mandates, including a
- 18 comparison of:
- 19 (A) the direct and indirect costs incurred by a
- 20 school district in complying with a federal educational mandate;
- 21 and
- 22 (B) the amount of funds received by the district
- 23 or state from the federal government to comply with the mandate;
- 24 (2) a list of all federal educational mandates for

- 1 which the federal government has not provided full payment or
- 2 reimbursement that results in expenditures accrued by a school
- 3 district or the state to comply with the federal educational
- 4 mandate; and
- 5 (3) recommendations to reduce the burden of federal
- 6 educational mandates on school districts.
- 7 SECTION 2. REPORT. Not later than December 31, 2020, the
- 8 Legislative Budget Board shall deliver a report of the board's
- 9 findings and recommendations to the legislature.
- 10 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION. This Act expires February 1, 2021.
- 11 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 12 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 13 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 14 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 15 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
