- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 61.088 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 61.088. STUDY REGARDING PRIMARY CARE PHYSICIAN
- 9 SHORTAGE. (a) The board shall conduct a study regarding methods to
- 10 mitigate or prevent a shortage in the number of primary care
- 11 physicians practicing in this state. The study:
- 12 (1) must include an analysis of whether requiring or
- 13 <u>incentivizing graduate medical education programs to increase the</u>
- 14 number of first-year residency positions leading to a medical
- 15 specialty in family practice or primary care to 50 percent of
- 16 first-year residency positions offered by the program will
- 17 positively impact the number of physicians who practice primary
- 18 care in this state; and
- 19 (2) may include an analysis of the feasibility of
- 20 providing additional funding for medical residencies for rural and
- 21 community-based hospital family practice and primary care
- 22 positions, including by providing funding for the repayment of
- 23 student loans for physicians under Subchapter J.
- 24 (b) Not later than December 1, 2020, the board shall submit

- 1 to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the
- 2 house of representatives a report on the results of the study and
- 3 any recommendations for legislative or other action.
- 4 (c) This section expires September 1, 2021.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
