## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to certification by a physical therapist of a person's 3 eligibility for license plates or parking placards issued to 4 persons with disabilities.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 504.201(d), Transportation Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:

(d) Except as provided by Subsection (d-1), the initial 8 9 application for specialty license plates under this section must be accompanied by a written statement from a physician [who is] 10 11 licensed to practice medicine or physical therapist licensed to 12 practice physical therapy in this state or in a state adjacent to this state or who is authorized by applicable law to practice 13 medicine or physical therapy, as applicable, in a hospital or other 14 health facility of the Department of Veterans Affairs. 15 If the 16 applicant has a mobility problem caused by a disorder of the foot, the written statement may be issued by a person licensed to practice 17 podiatry in this state or a state adjacent to this state. In this 18 subsection, "podiatry" has the meaning assigned by Section 681.001. 19 20 The statement must certify that the person making the application 21 or on whose behalf the application is made is legally blind or has a mobility problem that substantially impairs the person's ability to 22 23 ambulate. The statement must also certify whether a mobility problem is temporary or permanent. A written statement is not 24

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1 required as acceptable medical proof if:

(1) the person with a disability:

3 (A) has had a limb, hand, or foot amputated; or
4 (B) must use a wheelchair; and

5 (2) the applicant executes a statement attesting to6 the person's disability before the county assessor-collector.

7 SECTION 2. Section 681.003(c), Transportation Code, is 8 amended to read as follows:

9 Subject to Subsections (e) and (f), the first (c) 10 application must be accompanied by a notarized written statement or written prescription of a physician licensed to practice medicine 11 12 or physical therapist licensed to practice physical therapy in this state or a state adjacent to this state, or authorized by applicable 13 14 law to practice medicine or physical therapy, as applicable, in a 15 hospital or other health facility of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, certifying and providing evidence acceptable 16 17 to the department that the person making the application or on whose behalf the application is made is legally blind or has a mobility 18 problem that substantially impairs the person's ability 19 to The prescription 20 ambulate. statement or must include а 21 certification of whether the disability is temporary or permanent and information acceptable to the department to determine the type 22 23 of disabled parking placard for which the applicant is 24 eligible. The department shall determine a person's eligibility based on evidence provided by the applicant establishing legal 25 26 blindness or mobility impairment.

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SECTION 3. Section 681.004(d), Transportation Code, is

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1 amended to read as follows:

(d) A disabled parking placard issued to a person with a
temporary disability expires after the period set by the department
and may be renewed at the end of that period if the disability
remains as evidenced by a physician's <u>or physical therapist's</u>
statement or prescription submitted as required for a first
application under Section 681.003(c).

8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
