4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Sections 418.054, 418.055, and 418.056 to read as
7	follows:
8	Sec. 418.054. COORDINATING 9-1-1 TEXT MESSAGE CAPABILITY.
9	The division, in consultation with the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension
10	Service, shall coordinate state and local government efforts to
11	<pre>make 9-1-1 emergency service capable of receiving text messages</pre>
12	from a cellular telephone or other wireless communication device.
13	Sec. 418.055. DISASTER MOBILE APPLICATION. (a) The
14	division, in consultation with the Texas A&M Forest Service, shall
15	develop a mobile application for wireless communication devices to
16	communicate critical information during a disaster directly to
17	disaster victims and first responders.
18	(b) The mobile application may provide information on:
19	(1) road and weather conditions during a disaster; and
20	(2) disaster response and recovery activities.
21	Sec. 418.056. STUDY ON IMPROVING COMMUNICATIONS DURING
22	DISASTERS. (a) The division, in consultation with the Texas A&M
23	Engineering Extension Service, the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension
24	Service, and other appropriate entities, shall conduct a study on

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1	improving communication during a disaster. The study must:
2	(1) consider ways to improve and standardize the use
3	of social media as a communication tool during and after a disaster;
4	(2) examine the costs and benefits of promoting the
5	use of a standard communication format to create a single
6	comprehensive common operating framework;
7	(3) identify any costs that first responders may incur
8	in acquiring equipment complying with a standard communication
9	<pre>format;</pre>
10	(4) examine how private utility providers and the use
11	of the providers' portable satellite communications equipment and
12	portable mobile telephone towers may assist in response and
13	recovery after disasters; and
14	(5) examine how the state may use data analytics for
15	more effective and timely analysis of information to improve
16	disaster management.
17	(b) Not later than August 31, 2020, the division shall
18	submit to the governor, lieutenant governor, and members of the
19	legislature a report on the findings of the study.
20	(c) This section expires December 1, 2020.
21	SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
22	amended by adding Section 418.193 to read as follows:
23	Sec. 418.193. DISASTER WEB PORTAL. The Texas A&M
24	University System, in coordination with the governor and the
25	division, shall develop a comprehensive disaster web portal. The
26	web portal must:
27	(1) provide disaster information to the public,

1	including information on programs and services available to
2	disaster victims and funding for and expenditures of disaster
3	assistance programs;
4	(2) include information on disaster response and
5	recovery activities; and
6	(3) provide information on obtaining assistance from
7	the Federal Emergency Management Agency, state agencies, organized
8	volunteer groups, and any other entities providing disaster
9	assistance.
10	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
