4	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 418.054 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 418.054. WET DEBRIS WORK GROUP. (a) In this section:
7	(1) "Wet debris" means natural or man-made debris
8	located in bodies of water, including lakes, rivers, streams, bays,
9	wetlands, and tidal areas, that results from a disaster.
10	(2) "Work group" means the wet debris work group
11	established under this section.
12	(b) The wet debris work group is established and consists of
13	at least 13 but not more than 21 representatives of local, state,
14	and federal governmental entities and private entities who are
15	appointed by the governor from a list submitted by the lieutenant
16	governor and speaker of the house of representatives. The governor
17	shall, to the extent possible, appoint to the work group
18	representatives of:
19	(1) the division;
20	(2) the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality;
21	(3) the Texas Department of Transportation;
22	(4) the General Land Office;

5 SECTION 2. Not later than November 1, 2019, the governor 6 shall appoint members to the wet debris work group as required by 7 Section 418.054, Government Code, as added by this Act.

8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
