The department may contract for use of the consolidated 2 3 telecommunications system with: 4 (1)each house of the legislature; 5 (2) a legislative agency; 6 (3) an agency that is not a state agency as defined by 7 Section 2151.002; 8 (4) a political subdivision, including a county, municipality, or district; 9 (5) a private institution 10 of higher education accredited by a recognized accrediting agency, as defined by 11 Section 61.003, Education Code[, that: 12 (A) engages in distance learning, as defined by 13 Section 57.021, Utilities Code; and 14 15 (B) receives federal funds for distance learning 16 initiatives]; [and] 17 (6) an assistance organization, as defined by Section 2175.001; 18 19 (7) a governmental entity of another state; and 20 (8) a public safety entity, as defined by 47 U.S.C. Section 1401. 21 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 23 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 25 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
