A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the use of tax revenue by certain municipalities for the
3	payment of certain hotel-related bonds or other obligations.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Sections $351.102(e)$ and (g) , Tax Code, are
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(e) In addition to the municipalities described by
8	Subsection (b), that subsection also applies to:
9	(1) a municipality with a population of at least
10	110,000 but not more than 135,000 at least part of which is located
11	in a county with a population of not more than 135,000;
12	(2) a municipality with a population of at least 9,000
13	but not more than 10,000 that is located in two counties, each of
14	which has a population of at least 662,000 and a southern border
15	with a county with a population of 2.3 million or more;
16	(3) a municipality with a population of at least
17	200,000 but not more than 300,000 that contains a component
18	institution of the Texas Tech University System;
19	(4) a municipality with a population of at least
20	95,000 that borders Lake Lewisville;
21	(5) a municipality that:
22	(A) contains a portion of Cedar Hill State Park;
23	(B) has a population of more than 45,000;
24	(C) is located in two counties, one of which has a

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- 1 population of more than two million and one of which has a
- 2 population of more than 149,000; and
- 3 (D) has adopted a capital improvement plan for
- 4 the construction or expansion of a convention center facility;
- 5 (6) a municipality with a population of less than
- 6 6,000 that:
- 7 (A) is located in two counties each with a
- 8 population of 600,000 or more that are both adjacent to a county
- 9 with a population of two million or more;
- 10 (B) has full-time police and fire departments;
- 11 and
- 12 (C) has adopted a capital improvement plan for
- 13 the construction or expansion of a convention center facility;
- 14 (7) a municipality with a population of at least
- 15 56,000 that:
- 16 (A) borders Lake Ray Hubbard; and
- 17 (B) is located in two counties, one of which has a
- 18 population of less than 80,000;
- 19 (8) a municipality with a population of more than
- 20 83,000, that borders Clear Lake, and that is primarily located in a
- 21 county with a population of less than 300,000;
- 22 (9) a municipality with a population of less than
- 23 2,000 that:
- 24 (A) is located adjacent to a bay connected to the
- 25 Gulf of Mexico;
- 26 (B) is located in a county with a population of
- 27 290,000 or more that is adjacent to a county with a population of

- 1 four million or more; and
- 2 (C) has a boardwalk on the bay;
- 3 (10) a municipality with a population of 75,000 or
- 4 more that:
- 5 (A) is located wholly in one county with a
- 6 population of 575,000 or more that is adjacent to a county with a
- 7 population of four million or more; and
- 8 (B) has adopted a capital improvement plan for
- 9 the construction or expansion of a convention center facility;
- 10 (11) a municipality with a population of less than
- 11 75,000 that is located in three counties, at least one of which has
- 12 a population of at least four million; [and]
- 13 (12) an eligible coastal municipality with a
- 14 population of more than 3,000 but less than 5,000; and
- 15 (13) a municipality with a population of 6,100 or less
- 16 <u>that:</u>
- 17 (A) is located in two counties one with a
- 18 population of 788,400 or more and the other county with a population
- 19 of 666,700 or more; and
- 20 (B) contains a portion of state highway 289.
- 21 (q) A municipality to which this section applies may not
- 22 receive or pledge revenue or funds under Subsection (b) or (c) for a
- 23 hotel project unless the municipality enters into an agreement with
- 24 a person for the development of the hotel project before September
- 25 1, 2019.
- 26 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

3 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
