- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Chapter 38, Utilities Code, is amended by adding 5
- Section 38.102 to read as follows: 6
- Sec. 38.102. REPORT ON SAFETY PROCESSES AND INSPECTION. 7
- (a) Not later than May 1, 2020 each utility owning or operating 8
- 9 transmission or distribution assets shall complete a report, as
- prescribed by the Public Utility Commission of Texas, which 10
- includes, but is not limited to the following: 11
- 12 a summary description of the utility's hazard (1)
- recognition training program(s) for transmission and distribution 13
- 14 facilities provided by the utility to its employees and
- contractors; 15
- 16 (2) a summary description of the training programs
- provided by the utility to its employees and contractors related to 17
- the National Electric Safety Code and United States Corps of 18
- Engineers regulations and design requirements for the construction 19
- of electric transmission and distribution lines. 20
- 21 A utility is required to update this report within 30
- days of finalizing a change to any of the programs or plans 22
- 23 described in (1) or (2).
- (b) Not later than May 1st of each year, beginning on May 1, 2.4

- 1 2020, each utility owning or operating transmission or distribution
- 2 assets shall complete a report, as prescribed by the Public Utility
- 3 Commission of Texas, which includes, but is not limited to the
- 4 following:
- 5 (1) percentage of transmission and/or distribution
- 6 system or assets inspected in the prior calendar year;
- 7 (2) percentage of transmission and/or distribution
- 8 system anticipated to by inspected in the current calendar year;
- 9 (3) number of incidents reported by employees or the
- 10 public regarding transmission or distribution assets that are not
- 11 in compliance with the National Electric Safety Code, in whatever
- 12 manner they are reported;
- 13 (4) if the utility is aware of any portion of its
- 14 transmission or distribution system that is not in compliance with
- 15 the National Electric Safety Code;
- 16 (5) if the utility is aware of a violation of any
- 17 easement agreements, including but not limited to easement
- 18 agreements with the Army Corps of Engineers; and
- 19 (6) the number of fatalities or injuries resulting
- 20 from transmission or distribution assets that are out of compliance
- 21 with the National Electric Safety Code or any easement agreement.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
