## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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| 2  | relating to addressing adverse childhood experiences and         |
| 3  | developing a strategic plan to address those experiences.        |
| 4  | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:          |
| 5  | SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is        |
| 6  | amended by adding Section 531.0222 to read as follows:           |
| 7  | Sec. 531.0222. COORDINATION TO ADDRESS ADVERSE CHILDHOOD         |
| 8  | EXPERIENCES; PROGRESS REPORT AND STRATEGIC PLAN. (a) In this     |
| 9  | section, "adverse childhood experience" includes:                |
| 10 | (1) abuse as defined by Section 261.001, Family Code;            |
| 11 | (2) neglect as defined by Section 261.001, Family                |
| 12 | <pre>Code;</pre>   |
| 13 | (3) family violence as defined by Section 71.004,                |
| 14 | Family Code;   |
| 15 | (4) death of a parent;   |
| 16 | (5) parental separation or divorce; and                          |
| 17 | (6) substance use disorder, mental illness, or                   |
| 18 | incarceration of a member of a child's household.                |
| 19 | (b) A program, service, or support established under this        |
| 20 | section may not include sex education.                           |
| 21 | (c) In order to reduce exposure of children in this state to     |
| 22 | adverse childhood experiences and to address the social, health, |
| 23 | and economic impacts of those experiences, the commission, in    |
| 24 | collaboration with the Department of Family and Protective       |

- 2 Education Agency, the Texas Workforce Commission, the office of the
- 3 attorney general, the Texas Juvenile Justice Department, and an
- 4 institution of higher education, as defined by Section 61.003,
- 5 Education Code, with expertise in addressing adverse childhood
- 6 experiences through a public health framework shall:
- 7 (1) analyze data related to the causes and effects of
- 8 adverse childhood experiences, including data from the Behavioral
- 9 Risk Factor Surveillance System established by the Centers for
- 10 Disease Control and Prevention of the United States Public Health
- 11 Service;
- 12 (2) evaluate prevention needs and gaps in services and
- 13 support regarding awareness, assessments, and interventions
- 14 addressing adverse childhood experiences;
- 15 (3) identify methods to incorporate best practices for
- 16 preventing and treating adverse childhood experiences into
- 17 existing services and support programs offered for children and
- 18 families; and
- 19 (4) develop and implement a five-year strategic plan
- 20 to prevent and address adverse childhood experiences.
- 21 (d) In developing the five-year strategic plan under
- 22 <u>Subsection</u> (c)(4), the commission may collaborate with
- 23 representatives of:
- 24 (1) state and local agencies and nonprofit
- 25 organizations that work directly with children and families;
- 26 (2) child welfare services providers;
- 27 (3) early childhood education programs;

| 3  | (6) family support and social services providers;                   |
| 4  | (7) the law enforcement, judicial, and criminal                     |

| 9  | (10) the business and philanthropic communities.                    |
| 10 | (e) The strategic plan must incorporate a public health             |
| 11 | approach that promotes collaboration between agencies and           |
| 12 | community-based providers. The strategic plan may include           |
| 13 | strategies to:  |
| 14 | (1) train and educate professionals to assess,                      |
| 15 | intervene, and prevent adverse childhood experiences;               |
| 16 | (2) provide trauma-informed practices for families,                 |
| 17 | children, and providers impacted by adverse childhood experiences;  |
| 18 | (3) provide high quality child care;                                |
| 19 | (4) provide support to parents to develop social and                |
| 20 | economic independence;  |
| 21 | (5) provide support to strengthen the engagement of                 |
| 22 | fathers in their children's lives and establish paternity;          |
| 23 | (6) incorporate voluntary, evidence-based home                      |
| 24 | visiting programs to strengthen families and to connect families to |
| 25 | <pre>community resources;</pre>                                     |
| 26 | (7) develop parental support programs for teen parents              |
| 27 | and young mothers;  |

- 2 counseling programs;
- 3 (9) identify best practices for child protective
- 4 services and investigations;
- 5 (10) prevent and treat mental illness and substance
- 6 use disorder;
- 7 (11) prevent intimate partner and family violence; and
- 8 (12) prevent chronic diseases related to adverse
- 9 childhood experiences.
- 10 <u>(f) The entities listed in Subsection (c) shall develop a</u>
- 11 community awareness approach to implement the strategies and
- 12 recommendations in the strategic plan required under Subsection
- 13 (c)(4).
- 14 (g) The entities listed in Subsection (c) shall publish the
- 15 five-year strategic plan required by Subsection (c)(4) on their
- 16 <u>respective Internet websites.</u>
- SECTION 2. Not later than March 1, 2020, the Health and
- 18 Human Services Commission shall develop a progress report to
- 19 include data, best practices, and implementable changes within the
- 20 commission's current capacity.
- SECTION 3. Not later than December 31, 2020, the Health and
- 22 Human Services Commission shall:
- 23 (1) develop the five-year strategic plan required by
- 24 Section 531.0222(c)(4), Government Code, as added by this Act; and
- 25 (2) submit a report to the Senate Health and Human
- 26 Services Committee, the Senate Education Committee, the Senate
- 27 Criminal Justice Committee, the House Public Education Committee,

- 1 the House Juvenile Justice and Family Issues Committee, the House
- 2 Public Health Committee, and the House Human Services Committee
- 3 regarding the commission's strategies for preventing and treating
- 4 adverse childhood experiences and any plan to incorporate those
- 5 strategies into existing services and support programs for children
- 6 and families.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
