A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating to the reimbursement of wound care education and training
3	services providers under Medicaid.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- 6 is amended by adding Section 32.02491 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 32.02491. REIMBURSEMENT OF CERTAIN PROVIDERS OF WOUND
- 8 CARE EDUCATION AND TRAINING SERVICES. (a) The commission shall
- 9 provide medical assistance reimbursement to an authorized wound
- 10 care education and training services provider who provides to a
- 11 recipient necessary wound care education and training.
- (b) The commission shall approve a person as an authorized
- 13 wound care education and training services provider if the person:
- (1) is enrolled as a provider under the medical
- 15 assistance program; and

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- (2) meets quality standards for wound care education
- 17 and training approved by the commission.
- 18 <u>(c) An authorized wound care education and training</u>
- 19 <u>services provider shall determine a recipient's need for wound care</u>
- 20 education and training services. The provider must certify that
- 21 the education and training is necessary for the recipient to
- 22 provide self-care in order to assist in wound care management and to
- 23 improve the recipient's health care outcomes.
- 24 (d) The executive commissioner, after consulting with

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- 1 organizations that assist individuals with wound care, including
- 2 recipients of medical assistance, shall:
- 3 (1) adopt reimbursement rates for an authorized wound
- 4 care education and training services provider for the provision of
- 5 wound care education and training services; and
- 6 (2) establish outcome measures for evaluating the
- 7 health care outcomes of recipients who receive wound care education
- 8 and training services from an authorized wound care education and
- 9 training services provider.
- 10 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 11 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 12 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 13 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 14 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 15 waiver or authorization is granted.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
