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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to suicide prevention in public school curriculum and certain educational programs concerning suicide prevention and 3 substance abuse prevention. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 21.451(d), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 The staff development: 8 (d) 9 (1) may include training in: 10 (A) technology; 11 (B) conflict resolution; 12 (C) discipline strategies, including classroom management, district discipline policies, and the student code of 13 14 conduct adopted under Section 37.001 and Chapter 37; (D) preventing, identifying, responding to, and 15 reporting incidents of bullying; and 16 17 (E) digital learning; 18 (2) subject to Subsection (e) and to Section 21.3541 and rules adopted under that section, must include training that is 19 evidence-based, as defined by Section 8101, Every Student Succeeds 20 21 Act (20 U.S.C. Section 7801), that: 22 (A) relates to instruction of students with 23 disabilities; and is designed for educators who work primarily 24 (B)

No. 4193 1 outside the area of special education; and 2 (3) must include suicide prevention training that must 3 be provided: 4 (A) on an annual basis, as part of a new employee 5 orientation, to all new school district and open-enrollment charter school educators; and 6 7 (B) to existing school district and open-enrollment charter school educators on a biennial basis 8 9 [schedule adopted by the agency by rule]. SECTION 2. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by 10 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as 11 follows: 12 Each school district that offers kindergarten through 13 (a) 14 grade 12 shall offer, as a required curriculum: 15 (1)a foundation curriculum that includes: 16 (A) English language arts; 17 (B) mathematics; (C) science; and 18 social studies, consisting of Texas, United 19 (D) States, and world history, government, economics, with emphasis on 20 the free enterprise system and its benefits, and geography; and 21 22 (2) an enrichment curriculum that includes: (A) to the extent possible, languages other than 23 24 English; 25 (B) health, with emphasis on: 26 (i) physical health, including the importance of proper nutrition and exercise; 27

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1	(ii) mental health, including instruction
2	on mental health conditions, substance abuse, skills to manage
3	emotions, establishing and maintaining positive relationships, and
4	responsible decision-making; and
5	(iii) suicide prevention, including
6	recognizing suicide-related risk factors and warning signs;
7	(C) physical education;
8	(D) fine arts;
9	(E) career and technology education;
10	(F) technology applications;
11	(G) religious literature, including the Hebrew
12	Scriptures (Old Testament) and New Testament, and its impact on
13	history and literature; and
14	(H) personal financial literacy.
15	(a-1) In adopting the essential knowledge and skills for the
16	health curriculum under Subsection (a)(2)(B), the State Board of
17	Education shall adopt essential knowledge and skills that address:
18	(1) the relationship between drug and alcohol use and
19	suicide;
20	(2) recognizing signs of suicidal tendencies and other
21	warning signs of suicide; and
22	(3) help-seeking behaviors and available community
23	suicide prevention services.
24	SECTION 3. Section 28.004, Education Code, is amended by
25	amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (o) to read as
26	follows:
27	(c) The local school health advisory council's duties

for collaboration between the school district and community 2 3 organizations or agencies. 4 (o) The local school health advisory council shall make policy recommendations to the district to increase parental 5 awareness of suicide-related risk factors and warning signs and 6 7 available community suicide prevention services. 8 SECTION 4. Section 161.325(a-1), Health and Safety Code, as amended by Chapter 714 (H.B. 4056) and Chapter 522 (S.B. 179), Acts 9 10 of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, is reenacted and amended to read as follows: 11 12 (a-1) The list must include programs and practices in the 13 following areas: 14 (1)early mental health prevention and intervention; 15 (2) [mental health promotion; [(3)] substance abuse prevention and intervention; 16 17 (3) [(4) substance abuse intervention; [(5)] suicide prevention, intervention, 18 and 19 postvention; (4) [(6)] grief-informed trauma-informed 20 and practices; 21 (5) [(7)] building skills 22 related to managing emotions, establishing and maintaining positive relationships, and 23 24 responsible decision-making; (6) [(8)] positive 25 behavior interventions and 26 supports and positive youth development; and 27 (7) [(9)] safe, [and] supportive, and positive school

(5) if feasible, joint use agreements or strategies

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2 SECTION 5. Section 161.325, Health and Safety Code, is 3 amended by adding Subsection (a-4) and amending Subsections (b) and 4 (d) to read as follows:

5 <u>(a-4)</u> In this section, "postvention" includes activities 6 that promote healing necessary to reduce the risk of suicide by a 7 person affected by the suicide of another.

8 (b) The suicide prevention programs on the list must include 9 components that provide for training counselors, teachers, nurses, 10 administrators, and other staff, as well as law enforcement 11 officers and social workers who regularly interact with students, 12 to:

(1) recognize students at risk of committing suicide, including students who are or may be the victims of or who engage in bullying;

16 (2) recognize students displaying early warning signs 17 and a possible need for early mental health or substance abuse 18 intervention, which warning signs may include declining academic 19 performance, depression, anxiety, isolation, unexplained changes 20 in sleep or eating habits, and destructive behavior toward self and 21 others; [and]

(3) intervene effectively with students described by
Subdivision (1) or (2) by providing notice and referral to a parent
or guardian so appropriate action, such as seeking mental health or
substance abuse services, may be taken by a parent or guardian; and
(4) assist students in returning to school following
treatment of a mental health concern or suicide attempt.

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1 (d) A school district <u>shall</u> [may] develop practices and 2 procedures concerning each area listed in Subsection (a-1), 3 including mental health promotion and intervention, substance 4 abuse prevention and intervention, and suicide prevention, that:

5 (1) include a procedure for providing notice of a 6 recommendation for early mental health or substance abuse 7 intervention regarding a student to a parent or guardian of the 8 student within a reasonable amount of time after the identification 9 of early warning signs as described by Subsection (b)(2);

10 (2) include a procedure for providing notice of a 11 student identified as at risk of committing suicide to a parent or 12 guardian of the student within a reasonable amount of time after the 13 identification of early warning signs as described by Subsection 14 (b)(2);

(3) establish that the district may develop a reporting mechanism and may designate at least one person to act as a liaison officer in the district for the purposes of identifying students in need of early mental health or substance abuse intervention or suicide prevention; [and]

(4) set out available counseling alternatives for a
parent or guardian to consider when their child is identified as
possibly being in need of early mental health or substance abuse
intervention or suicide prevention; and

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(5) include procedures:

25 <u>(A) to support the return of a student to school</u> 26 following hospitalization or residential treatment for a mental

27 <u>health condition or substance abuse; and</u>

H.B. No. 4193 1 <u>(B) for suicide prevention, intervention, and</u> 2 <u>postvention</u>.
