- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- 6 is amended by adding Section 32.02472 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 32.02472. ELIGIBILITY OF CERTAIN PERSONS LAWFULLY
- 8 PRESENT IN THE UNITED STATES. (a) The commission shall provide
- 9 medical assistance in accordance with 8 U.S.C. Section 1612(b) to a
- 10 person who:
- 11 (1) is a qualified alien, as defined by 8 U.S.C.
- 12 <u>Sections 1641(b) and (c);</u>
- 13 (2) meets the eligibility requirements of the medical
- 14 assistance program;
- 15 (3) entered the United States on or after August 22,
- 16 1996; and
- 17 (4) has resided in the United States for a period of
- 18 seven years after the date the person entered as a qualified alien.
- 19 <u>(b) To the extent allowed by federal law, the commission</u>
- 20 shall provide medical assistance for pregnant women to a person who
- 21 is pregnant and is lawfully present, or lawfully residing in the
- 22 United States as defined by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
- 23 Services, including a battered alien under 8 U.S.C. Section
- 24 1641(c), regardless of the date the person entered the United

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1 States.

- 2 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 3 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 4 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 5 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 6 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 7 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
