Section 25.0003(c), Government Code, as amended 20 by this Act, applies only to a cause of action filed on or after the 21 effective date of this Act. A cause of action filed before the 22 23 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, and that law is continued in effect 24
