## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to permitting the viewing of certain body worn camera

3 recordings.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 1701.660, Occupations Code, is amended

6 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as

7 follows:

- 8 (a) Except as provided by <u>Subsections (a-1) and</u>
- 9 [Subsection] (b), a recording created with a body worn camera and
- 10 documenting an incident that involves the use of deadly force by a
- 11 peace officer or that is otherwise related to an administrative or
- 12 criminal investigation of an officer may not be deleted, destroyed,
- 13 or released to the public until all criminal matters have been
- 14 finally adjudicated and all related administrative investigations
- 15 have concluded.
- 16 <u>(a-1)</u> A law enforcement agency may permit a person who is
- 17 depicted in a recording of an incident described by Subsection (a)
- 18 or, if the person is deceased, the person's authorized
- 19 representative, to view the recording, provided that the law
- 20 enforcement agency determines that the viewing furthers a law
- 21 enforcement purpose and provided that any authorized
- 22 representative who is permitted to view the recording was not a
- 23 witness to the incident. A person viewing a recording may not
- 24 duplicate the recording or capture video or audio from the

- 1 recording. A permitted viewing of a recording under this
- 2 <u>subsection</u> is not considered to be a release of public information
- 3 for purposes of Chapter 552, Government Code.
- 4 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
- 5 recording held by a law enforcement agency on or after the effective
- 6 date of this Act, regardless of whether the recording was created
- 7 before, on, or after that date.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
