A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the percentage of voters needed to sign a petition 3 requesting a local option election to prohibit or authorize the 4 sale of alcoholic beverages.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Section 501.032(a), Election Code, is amended to

7 read as follows:

8 (a) The commissioners court, at its next regular session on 9 or after the 30th day after the date the petition is filed, shall 10 order a local option election to be held on the issue set out in the 11 petition if the petition is filed with the voter registrar not later 12 than the 60th day after the date the petition is issued and bears 13 the actual signatures of a number of qualified voters of the 14 political subdivision equal to at least:

(1) <u>20</u> [35] percent of the registered voters in the
subdivision who voted in the most recent gubernatorial election for
a ballot issue that permits voting for or against:

18 (A) "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages19 for off-premise consumption only.";

20 (B) "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages
21 except mixed beverages.";

(C) "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages
 including mixed beverages."; or

(D) "The legal sale of mixed beverages.";

1 (2) <u>20</u> [25] percent of the registered voters in the 2 political subdivision who voted in the most recent general election 3 for a ballot issue that permits voting for or against "The legal 4 sale of wine on the premises of a holder of a winery permit."; or

5 (3) <u>20</u> [35] percent of the registered voters in the 6 political subdivision who voted in the most recent gubernatorial 7 election for an election on any other ballot issue.

8 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 9 a petition filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A 10 petition filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by 11 the law in effect when the petition is filed, and the former law is 12 continued in effect for that purpose.

13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
