## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to requirements for a juvenile's appearance in a judicial 3 proceeding. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 54, Family Code, is amended by adding 5 Sections 54.12 and 54.13 to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 54.12. USE OF RESTRAINTS. (a) A mechanical or physical restraint may not be used on a child during a judicial 8 9 proceeding and any restraint must be removed before the child's appearance before the court unless the court finds that: 10 11 (1) the use of a mechanical or physical restraint is 12 necessary: (A) to prevent physical injury to the child or 13 14 another; or 15 (B) because the child has a history of disruptive 16 courtroom behavior that has placed others in potentially harmful 17 situations; and 18 (2) the mechanical or physical restraint used is the 19 least restrictive restraint effective to prevent physical injury to the child or another or the child's escape. 20 21 (b) The court shall provide the child's attorney an opportunity to be heard before the court may order the use of a 22 23 mechanical or physical restraint. If the use of a restraint is ordered, the court shall make findings of fact in support of the 24

- 1 <u>order</u>. Sec. 54.13. CLOTHING DURING JUDICIAL PROCEEDING. (a) 2 During a judicial proceeding, a court shall permit a child to wear 3 4 clothing other than a uniform provided by a detention or correctional facility. 5 6 (b) If at the time of the judicial proceeding the child does 7 not have access to any clothing other than a uniform provided by a detention or correctional facility, the court shall provide the 8 child with appropriate clothing. 9

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
