- 3 (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), the [The] board
- 4 may determine whether:
- 5 (1) an act constitutes the practice of medicine, not

- 7 (2) a medical act may be properly or safely delegated
- 8 by physicians.
- 9 (d) The following acts constitute the practice of medicine
- 10 and may not be delegated by a physician:
- 11 (1) reading or interpreting a radiological study; and
- 12 (2) rendering a diagnosis based on a radiological
- 13 study.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
