- 18 (c) The sheriff of a county with a population of 900,000 or
- 19 more [than 3.3 million] may designate as exempt from the civil
- 20 service system:
- 21 (1) the position of chief deputy;
- 22 (2) one or more positions in the office of
- 23 departmental legal counsel; and
- 24 (3) additional positions in the department[, not to

- 8 (d) At the time a new sheriff takes office, an employee
- 9 holding an exempt position may be transferred to the nonexempt
- 10 position held by the employee immediately before being promoted to
- 11 an exempt position. A person who was not an officer in the
- 12 department when appointed to an exempt position may be transferred
- 13 only to an entry level position within the pay grade of that exempt
- 14 position in accordance with the system's civil service rules.
- 15 (e) Not later than the 90th day after the date a sheriff
- 16 designates a position as exempt under this section, an employee may
- 17 request a transfer to the nonexempt position held by the employee
- 18 before the employee's last promotion.
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
