7 SECTION 2. Section 84.0066, Civil Practice and Remedies 8 Code, as added by this Act, does not apply to a cause of action that 9 accrued before the effective date of this Act. A cause of action 10 that accrued before the effective date of this Act is governed by 11 the law applicable to the cause of action immediately before that 12 date, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
