5	SECTION 1. Section 437.0194, Health and Safety Code, is

7	Sec. 437.0194. CERTAIN SALES BY COTTAGE FOOD PRODUCTION
8	OPERATIONS PROHIBITED OR RESTRICTED. (a) A cottage food
9	production operation may not sell any of the foods described in
10	Section 437.001(2-b)(A)[÷
11	[ <del>(1) through the Internet;</del>
12	[ <del>(2) by mail order; or</del>
13	$\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$ at wholesale.
14	(b) An individual who operates a cottage food production
15	operation may sell a food described by Section 437.001(2-b)(A)
16	through the Internet or by mail order or use a shipping or delivery
17	service for delivery of the food only if the label of the finished
18	food product or a written description of the finished food product
19	provided with the product:
20	(1) contains a list of each major food allergen,
21	including eggs, nuts, soy, peanuts, milk, or wheat, in the product;
22	(2) includes:
23	(A) the name and physical address of the cottage
24	food production operation;

1	(B) the common or usual name of the product; and
2	(C) the following statement: "This food is made
3	in a home kitchen and is not inspected by the Department of State
4	Health Services or a local health department."; and
5	(3) is legible.
6	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
