- 14 community-based licensed mental health professionals,
- 15 community-based organizations, and faith-based organizations;

- 17 (4) coordinate services for justice involved
- 18 veterans; and
- 19 (5) coordinate local delivery to veterans and
- 20 <u>immediate family members of veterans of mental health first aid for</u>
- 21 veterans training.
- 22 SECTION 2. Section 1001.205, Health and Safety Code, is
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 1001.205. REPORTS. (a) Not later than September 30 of

- 1 each year, a local mental health authority shall provide to the
- 2 department the number of:
- 3 (1) employees and contractors of the authority who
- 4 were trained as mental health first aid trainers under Section
- 5 1001.202 during the preceding fiscal year;
- 6 (2) university employees, school district employees,
- 7 and school resource officers who completed a mental health first
- 8 aid training program offered by the authority under Section
- 9 1001.203 during the preceding fiscal year; [and]
- 10 (3) individuals who are not university employees,
- 11 school district employees, or school resource officers who
- 12 completed a mental health first aid training program offered by the
- 13 authority during the preceding fiscal year; and
- 14 (4) veterans and immediate family members of veterans
- 15 who completed the veterans module of a mental health first aid
- 16 training program offered by the authority during the preceding
- 17 fiscal year.
- 18 (b) Not later than December 1 of each year, the department
- 19 shall compile the information submitted by local mental health
- 20 authorities as required by Subsection (a) and submit a report to the
- 21 legislature containing the number of:
- 22 (1) authority employees and contractors trained as
- 23 mental health first aid trainers during the preceding fiscal year;
- 24 (2) university employees, school district employees,
- 25 and school resource officers who completed a mental health first
- 26 aid training program provided by an authority during the preceding
- 27 fiscal year; [and]

- 1 (3) individuals who are not university employees,
- 2 school district employees, or school resource officers who
- 3 completed a mental health first aid training program provided by an
- 4 authority during the preceding fiscal year; and
- 5 (4) veterans and immediate family members of veterans
- 6 who completed the veterans module of a mental health first aid
- 7 training program provided by an authority during the preceding
- 8 <u>fiscal year</u>.
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 1001.222(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) The department shall develop a mental health
- 12 intervention program for veterans. The program must include:
- 13 (1) peer-to-peer counseling;
- 14 (2) access to licensed mental health professionals for
- 15 peer service coordinators and peers;
- 16 (3) training approved by the department for peer
- 17 service coordinators, licensed mental health professionals, and
- 18 peers;
- 19 (4) technical assistance for peer service
- 20 coordinators, licensed mental health professionals, and peers;
- 21 (5) identification, retention, and screening of
- 22 community-based licensed mental health professionals;
- 23 (6) suicide prevention training for peer service
- 24 coordinators and peers; [and]
- 25 (7) veteran jail diversion services, including
- 26 veterans treatment courts; and
- 27 (8) coordination of mental health first aid for

- 1 veterans training to veterans and immediate family members of
- 2 <u>veterans</u>.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
