The program must include: 2 3 (1)peer-to-peer counseling; 4 (2) access to licensed mental health professionals for 5 peer service coordinators and peers; 6 (3) training approved by the department for peer 7 service coordinators, licensed mental health professionals, and 8 peers; 9 (4) technical assistance for service peer 10 coordinators, licensed mental health professionals, and peers; identification, retention, and screening of 11 (5) community-based licensed mental health professionals; 12 suicide prevention training for peer 13 (6) service 14 coordinators and peers; [and] 15 (7) veteran jail diversion services, including 16 veterans treatment courts; and 17 (8) training for veterans and immediate family members of veterans on mental health first aid for veterans. 18 SECTION 3. Section 1001.224, Health and Safety Code, is 19 amended to read as follows: 20 Sec. 1001.224. ANNUAL REPORT. Not later than December 1 of 21 each year, the department shall submit a report to the governor and 22 23 the legislature that includes: 24 (1) the number of veterans who received services 25 through the mental health program for veterans; 26 (2) the number of peers and peer service coordinators trained; 27
