4	SECTION 1. Sec. 423.001. DEFINITION. (a) In this chapter,

13	detention facility, as defined by Section 51.02, Family Code.
14	(2) "Dam" means any barrier, including any appurtenant

17	(3) "Detention facility" means a facility operated by
18	or under contract with United States Immigration and Customs
19	Enforcement for the purpose of detaining aliens and placing them in
20	removal proceedings.
21	(4) "image" means any capturing of sound waves,
22	thermal, infrared, ultraviolet, visible light, or other
23	electromagnetic waves, odor, or other conditions existing on or
24	about real property in this state or an individual located on that

- 2 (5) "sports venue" means an arena, automobile
- 3 racetrack, coliseum, stadium, or other type of area or facility
- 4 that:
- 5 (A) $\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ has a seating capacity of 30,000 or more
- 6 people; and
- 7 $(B) \frac{(B)}{(2)}$ is primarily used for one or more
- 8 professional or amateur sports or athletics events.
- 9 SECTION 2. Sec. 423.002. NONAPPLICABILITY. (a) It is
- 10 lawful to capture an image using an unmanned aircraft in this state:
- 11 (1) for the purpose of professional or scholarly
- 12 research and development or for another academic purpose by a
- 13 person acting on behalf of an institution of higher education or a
- 14 private or independent institution of higher education, as those
- 15 terms are defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, including a
- 16 person who:
- 17 (A) is a professor, employee, or student of the
- 18 institution; or
- 19 (B) is under contract with or otherwise acting
- 20 under the direction or on behalf of the institution;
- 21 (2) in airspace designated as a test site or range
- 22 authorized by the Federal Aviation Administration for the purpose
- 23 of integrating unmanned aircraft systems into the national
- 24 airspace;
- 25 (3) as part of an operation, exercise, or mission of
- 26 any branch of the United States military;
- 27 (4) if the image is captured by a satellite for the

- 1 purposes of mapping;
- 2 (5) if the image is captured by or for an electric or
- 3 natural gas utility or a telecommunications provider:
- 4 (A) for operations and maintenance of utility or
- 5 telecommunications facilities for the purpose of maintaining
- 6 utility or telecommunications system reliability and integrity;
- 7 (B) for inspecting utility or telecommunications
- 8 facilities to determine repair, maintenance, or replacement needs
- 9 during and after construction of such facilities;
- 10 (C) for assessing vegetation growth for the
- 11 purpose of maintaining clearances on utility or telecommunications
- 12 easements; and
- 13 (D) for utility or telecommunications facility
- 14 routing and siting for the purpose of providing utility or
- 15 telecommunications service;
- 16 (6) with the consent of the individual who owns or
- 17 lawfully occupies the real property captured in the image;
- 18 (7) pursuant to a valid search or arrest warrant;
- 19 (8) if the image is captured by a law enforcement
- 20 authority or a person who is under contract with or otherwise acting
- 21 under the direction or on behalf of a law enforcement authority:
- (A) in immediate pursuit of a person law
- 23 enforcement officers have reasonable suspicion or probable cause to
- 24 suspect has committed an offense, not including misdemeanors or
- 25 offenses punishable by a fine only;
- 26 (B) for the purpose of documenting a crime scene
- 27 where an offense, not including misdemeanors or offenses punishable

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1 by a fine only, has been committed;
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- 2 (C) for the purpose of investigating the scene
- 3 of:
- 4 (i) a human fatality;
- 5 (ii) a motor vehicle accident causing death
- 6 or serious bodily injury to a person; or
- 7 (iii) any motor vehicle accident on a state

- 11 (E) for the purpose of conducting a high-risk
- 12 tactical operation that poses a threat to human life;

- 16 (G) of real property or a person on real property
- 17 that is within 25 miles of the United States border for the sole
- 18 purpose of ensuring border security;
- 19 (9) if the image is captured by state or local law
- 20 enforcement authorities, or a person who is under contract with or
- 21 otherwise acting under the direction or on behalf of state
- 22 authorities, for the purpose of:
- 23 (A) surveying the scene of a catastrophe or other
- 24 damage to determine whether a state of emergency should be
- 25 declared;
- 26 (B) preserving public safety, protecting
- 27 property, or surveying damage or contamination during a lawfully

- 1 declared state of emergency; or
- 2 (C) conducting routine air quality sampling and
- 3 monitoring, as provided by state or local law;
- 4 (10) at the scene of a spill, or a suspected spill, of
- 5 hazardous materials;
- 6 (11) for the purpose of fire suppression;
- 7 (12) for the purpose of rescuing a person whose life or
- 8 well-being is in imminent danger;
- 9 (13) if the image is captured by a Texas licensed real
- 10 estate broker in connection with the marketing, sale, or financing
- 11 of real property, provided that no individual is identifiable in

- 5 SECTION 3. Sec. 423.003. OFFENSE: ILLEGAL USE OF UNMANNED
- 6 AIRCRAFT TO CAPTURE IMAGE. OPERATION OF UNMANNED AIRCRAFT OVER
- 7 CORRECTIONAL FACILITY, DETENTION FACILITY, OR CRITICAL
- 8 INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITY OR SPORTS VENUE. (a) A person commits an
- 9 offense if the person uses an unmanned aircraft to capture an image
- 10 of an individual or privately owned real property in this state with
- 11 the intent to conduct surveillance on the individual or property
- 12 captured in the image.
- 13 (b) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
- 14 (c) It is a defense to prosecution under this section that
- 15 the person destroyed the image:
- 16 (1) as soon as the person had knowledge that the image
- 17 was captured in violation of this section; and

20	SECTION 4. Sec. 423.00 45 . ILLEGALLY OR INCIDENTALLY
21	CAPTURED IMAGES NOT SUBJECT TO DISCLOSURE. (a) Except as otherwise
22	provided by Subsection (b), an image captured in violation of
23	Section 423.003, or an image captured by an unmanned aircraft that
24	was incidental to the lawful capturing of an image:
25	(1) may not be used as evidence in any criminal or
26	juvenile proceeding, civil action, or administrative proceeding;
27	(2) is not subject to disclosure, inspection, or

- 1 copying under Chapter 552; and
- 2 (3) is not subject to discovery, subpoena, or other
- 3 means of legal compulsion for its release.
- 4 (b) An image described by Subsection (a) may be disclosed
- 5 and used as evidence to prove a violation of this chapter and is
- 6 subject to discovery, subpoena, or other means of legal compulsion
- 7 for that purpose.
- 8 Sec. 423.006. CIVIL ACTION. (a) An owner or tenant of
- 9 privately owned real property located in this state may bring
- 10 against a person who, in violation of Section 423.003, captured an
- 11 image of the property or the owner or tenant while on the property
- 12 an action to:
- 13 (1) enjoin a violation or imminent violation of
- 14 Section 423.003 or 423.004;
- 15 (2) recover a civil penalty of:
- 16 (A) \$5,000 for all images captured in a single
- 17 episode in violation of Section 423.003; or
- 18 (B) \$10,000 for disclosure, display,
- 19 distribution, or other use of any images captured in a single
- 20 episode in violation of Section 423.004; or
- 21 (3) recover actual damages if the person who captured
- 22 the image in violation of Section <u>423.003</u> discloses, displays, or
- 23 distributes the image with malice.
- 24 (b) For purposes of recovering the civil penalty or actual
- 25 damages under Subsection (a), all owners of a parcel of real
- 26 property are considered to be a single owner and all tenants of a
- 27 parcel of real property are considered to be a single tenant.

- 1 (c) In this section, "malice" has the meaning assigned by
- 2 Section 41.001, Civil Practice and Remedies Code.
- 3 (d) In addition to any civil penalties authorized under this
- 4 section, the court shall award court costs and reasonable
- 5 attorney's fees to the prevailing party.
- 6 (e) Venue for an action under this section is governed by
- 7 Chapter 15, Civil Practice and Remedies Code.
- 8 (f) An action brought under this section must be commenced
- 9 within two years from the date the image was:
- 10 (1) captured in violation of Section 423.003; or
- 11 (2) initially disclosed, displayed, distributed, or
- 12 otherwise used in violation of Section 423.004.
- 13 SECTION 5. Sec. 423.0057. RULES FOR USE BY LAW ENFORCEMENT.
- 14 The Department of Public Safety shall adopt rules and guidelines
- 15 for use of an unmanned aircraft by a law enforcement authority in
- 16 this state.
- 17 SECTION 6. Sec. 423.0068. REPORTING BY LAW ENFORCEMENT
- 18 AGENCY. (a) Not earlier than January 1 and not later than January
- 19 15 of each odd-numbered year, each state law enforcement agency and
- 20 each county or municipal law enforcement agency located in a county
- 21 or municipality, as applicable, with a population greater than
- 22 150,000, that used or operated an unmanned aircraft during the
- 23 preceding 24 months shall issue a written report to the governor,
- 24 the lieutenant governor, and each member of the legislature and
- 25 shall:
- 26 (1) retain the report for public viewing; and
- 27 (2) post the report on the law enforcement agency's

- 1 publicly accessible website, if one exists.
- 2 (b) The report must include:
- 3 (1) the number of times an unmanned aircraft was used,
- 4 organized by date, time, location, and the types of incidents and
- 5 types of justification for the use;
- 6 (2) the number of criminal investigations aided by the
- 7 use of an unmanned aircraft and a description of how the unmanned
- 8 aircraft aided each investigation;
- 9 (3) the number of times an unmanned aircraft was used
- 10 for a law enforcement operation other than a criminal
- 11 investigation, the dates and locations of those operations, and a
- 12 description of how the unmanned aircraft aided each operation;
- 13 (4) the type of information collected on an
- 14 individual, residence, property, or area that was not the subject
- 15 of a law enforcement operation and the frequency of the collection
- 16 of this information; and
- 17 (5) the total cost of acquiring, maintaining,
- 18 repairing, and operating or otherwise using each unmanned aircraft
- 19 for the preceding 24 months.
- 20 SECTION 7. Sec. 423.0079. REGULATION OF UNMANNED AIRCRAFT
- 21 BY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION. (a) In this section:
- 22 (1) "Political subdivision" includes a county, a joint
- 23 board created under Section 22.074, Transportation Code, and a
- 24 municipality.
- 25 (2) "Special event" means a festival, celebration, or
- 26 other gathering that:
- 27 (A) involves:

- 1 (i) the reservation and temporary use of
- 2 all or a portion of a public park, road, or other property of a
- 3 political subdivision; and
- 4 (ii) entertainment, the sale of
- 5 merchandise, food, or beverages, or mass participation in a sports
- 6 event; and
- 7 (B) requires a significant use or coordination of
- 8 a political subdivision's services.
- 9 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a political
- 10 subdivision may not adopt or enforce any ordinance, order, or other
- 11 similar measure regarding the operation of an unmanned aircraft.
- 12 (c) A political subdivision may adopt and enforce an
- 13 ordinance, order, or other similar measure regarding:
- 14 (1) the use of an unmanned aircraft during a special
- 15 event;
- 16 (2) the political subdivision's use of an unmanned
- 17 aircraft; or
- 18 (3) the use of an unmanned aircraft near a facility or
- 19 infrastructure owned by the political subdivision, if the political
- 20 subdivision:
- 21 (A) applies for and receives authorization from
- 22 the Federal Aviation Administration to adopt the regulation; and
- 23 (B) after providing reasonable notice, holds a
- 24 public hearing on the political subdivision's intent to apply for
- 25 the authorization.
- 26 (d) An ordinance, order, or other similar measure that
- 27 violates Subsection (b) is void and unenforceable.

- 1 SECTION 8. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
