- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 36, Penal Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Section 36.061 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 36.061. RETALIATION INVOLVING IMMIGRATION STATUS. (a)
- 8 A person commits an offense if the person, with the intent to
- 9 prevent or delay the service of another as a prospective informant
- 10 or witness, intentionally or knowingly:
- 11 (1) reports or threatens to report the other person's
- 12 immigration status to United States Immigration and Customs
- 13 Enforcement or another law enforcement agency; or
- 14 (2) destroys or withholds, or threatens to destroy or
- 15 withhold, a form of government-issued identifying documentation
- 16 <u>issued to the other person.</u>
- (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), an offense under
- 18 this section is a felony of the third degree.
- 19 (c) An offense under this section is a felony of the second
- 20 degree if the victim was a prospective informant in the
- 21 investigation of, or a prospective witness in the prosecution of,
- 22 an offense:
- 23 (1) involving family violence, as defined by Section
- 24 71.004, Family Code; or

- 1 (2) under Section 20A.02, 20A.03, 21.02, 21.11,
- 2 22.011, or 22.021, Penal Code.
- 3 (d) If conduct that constitutes an offense under this
- 4 section also constitutes an offense under any other law, the actor
- 5 may be prosecuted under this section or the other law.
- 6 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 7 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 8 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 9 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 10 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 11 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 12 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 13 before that date.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
