3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 28.0105 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 28.0105. ELECTIVE COURSE IN HUMAN RIGHTS. (a) A
7	school district may offer an elective course in human rights based
8	on the model curriculum developed under Subsection (b) to students
9	in middle school, junior high school, and high school. The course
10	provided to high school students, if offered by the school
11	district, must meet the requirements for a one-half elective credit
12	under Section 28.025.
13	(b) The State Board of Education, in consultation with human
14	rights activists and academic professionals, shall develop a model
15	curriculum for an elective course in human rights. The model
16	curriculum must include:
17	(1) instruction in:
18	(A) global awareness;
19	(B) culture;
20	(C) the history of human rights; and
21	(D) the universal declaration of human rights;

23	(2) a community service and leadership component.
24	SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date

- 2 curriculum required under Section 28.0105(b), Education Code, as

- 4 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020
- 5 school year.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
