H.B. No. 4480

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a study on the use of art therapy in public schools and 3 on art therapy in higher education. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act: 5 6 (1) "Art therapy" means a form of therapy based on engagement in artistic activities, including visual and performing 7 arts, as a means of creative expression and symbolic communication 8 9 and used as a remedial or diagnostic activity. (2) "Mental health professional" has the 10 meaning 11 assigned by Section 61.601, Education Code. 12 SECTION 2. STUDY ON ART THERAPY IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS. (a) The 13 commissioner of education shall establish a task force to study the 14 utility, efficacy, and feasibility of providing art therapy to improve the mental health of public school students in this state. 15 The commissioner of education shall appoint members of 16 (b) the task force. The task force must include at least: 17 18 (1) one mental health professional; (2) one public school administrator or educator; and 19 20 (3) one parent of or person standing in parental 21 relation to a public school student in this state. 22 The task force shall prepare a written report that (C) includes: 23 a description of the activities of the task force; 24 (1)

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1 (2) an analysis of the impact of art therapy on the 2 mental health of school-aged children; including students with 3 disabilities.

4 (3) recommendations for legislative or other action; 5 and

6 (4) any other matters the task force considers 7 appropriate.

8 (d) Not later than December 1, 2020, the task force shall 9 submit the written report to the governor, lieutenant governor, 10 legislature, and commissioner of education.

11 SECTION 3. STUDY ON ART THERAPY IN HIGHER EDUCATION. (a) 12 The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall conduct a study 13 on the feasibility of institutions of higher education in this 14 state offering accredited higher education art therapy programs. 15 The coordinating board shall prepare a written report that:

16 (1) indicates whether any interest in higher education 17 art therapy programs exists;

18 (2) identifies the challenges an institution of higher
19 education may face in achieving accreditation for those programs;

20 (3) includes recommendations for legislative or other21 action; and

(4) includes any other matter the coordinating boardconsiders appropriate.

(b) Not later than December 1, 2020, the coordinating board shall submit the written report to the governor, lieutenant governor, and legislature.

27 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. This Act expires September 1, 2021.

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SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
 1, 2019.
