4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 707, Transportation Code,
6	is amended to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 707. PHOTOGRAPHIC TRAFFIC SIGNAL
8	ENFORCEMENT SYSTEM PROHIBITED
9	SECTION 2. Chapter 707, Transportation Code, is amended by
10	adding Sections 707.020, 707.021, and 707.022 to read as follows:
11	Sec. 707.020. PHOTOGRAPHIC TRAFFIC SIGNAL ENFORCEMENT
12	SYSTEM PROHIBITED. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, a local
13	authority may not implement or operate a photographic traffic
14	signal enforcement system with respect to a highway or street under
15	the jurisdiction of the authority.
16	(b) The attorney general shall enforce this section.
17	Sec. 707.021. USE OF EVIDENCE FROM PHOTOGRAPHIC TRAFFIC
18	SIGNAL ENFORCEMENT SYSTEM PROHIBITED. Notwithstanding any other
19	law, a local authority may not issue a civil or criminal charge or
20	citation for an offense or violation based on a recorded image
21	produced by a photographic traffic signal enforcement system.
22	Sec. 707.022. SCHOOL BUS USE EXCEPTED. This chapter does

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not apply to a photographic traffic signal enforcement system that

is capable of taking photographic or digital images of vehicles

- 1 that pass a school bus if:
- 2 (1) the system is used only for the prosecution of a
- 3 criminal offense; and
- 4 (2) a person who is cited for a criminal offense as a
- 5 result of evidence obtained by the system is authorized to contest
- 6 the citation in court.
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 27.031(a), Government Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (a) In addition to the jurisdiction and powers provided by
- 10 the constitution and other law, the justice court has original
- 11 jurisdiction of:
- 12 (1) civil matters in which exclusive jurisdiction is
- 13 not in the district or county court and in which the amount in
- 14 controversy is not more than \$10,000, exclusive of interest;
- 15 (2) cases of forcible entry and detainer; and
- 16 (3) foreclosure of mortgages and enforcement of liens
- 17 on personal property in cases in which the amount in controversy is
- 18 otherwise within the justice court's jurisdiction[; and
- 19 [(4) cases arising under Chapter 707, Transportation
- 20 Code, outside a municipality's territorial limits].
- SECTION 4. Section 780.003(b), Health and Safety Code, is

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   imposed by a local authority to enforce compliance with the
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   instructions of a traffic-control signal;

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   penalty described by Section 707.008(a)(1), Transportation Code,
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   imposed by a local authority to enforce compliance with the
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   instructions of a traffic-control signal].

         SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
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   a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
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   provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
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   Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
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Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
