A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the operation of motor-assisted scooters.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 551.351(1), Transportation Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	(1) "Motor-assisted scooter":
7	(A) means a self-propelled device with:
8	(i) at least two wheels in contact with the
9	ground during operation;
10	(ii) a braking system capable of stopping
11	the device under typical operating conditions;
12	(iii) a gas motor with a displacement not
13	exceeding 40 cubic centimeters or an electric motor with a power
14	<pre>output not exceeding 1,000 watts [40 cubic centimeters];</pre>
15	(iv) a deck designed to allow a person to
16	stand or sit while operating the device; and
17	(v) the ability to be propelled by human
18	power alone; and
19	(B) does not include a pocket bike or a
20	minimotorbike.
21	SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 551, Transportation Code,
22	is amended by adding Section 551.3515 to read as follows:
23	Sec. 551.3515. GENERAL OPERATION OF MOTOR-ASSISTED
24	SCOOTERS. (a) A person must hold a valid driver's license and be at

- 1 least 16 years of age to operate a motor-assisted scooter.
- 2 (b) A person may not use a motor-assisted scooter to carry
- 3 more than one person.
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 551.352, Transportation Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 551.352. OPERATION ON ROADWAYS OR BICYCLE PATHS
- 7 [SIDEWALKS]. (a) A person may operate a motor-assisted scooter
- 8 [may be operated] only:
- 9 (1) on a path set aside for the exclusive use of
- 10 bicycles, pedestrians, or both; or
- 11 (2) on a roadway in a bicycle lane, except as provided
- 12 by Subsection (b) [street or highway for which the posted speed
- 13 limit is 35 miles per hour or less. The motor-assisted scooter may
- 14 cross a road or street at an intersection where the road or street
- 15 has a posted speed limit of more than 35 miles per hour].
- 16 (b) A person may operate a motor-assisted scooter on a
- 17 roadway without a bicycle lane if:
- 18 (1) the roadway has a speed limit of 30 miles per hour
- 19 or less; and
- (2) the person rides as near as practicable to the
- 21 right curb or edge of the roadway, unless:
- (A) the person is:
- (i) operating the scooter on a one-way
- 24 roadway, in which case the operator shall ride as near as
- 25 practicable to the left curb or edge of the roadway;
- 26 (ii) overtaking or passing another vehicle
- 27 that is proceeding in the same direction;

- 1 (iii) preparing to execute a left turn; or
 2 (iv) riding alongside not more than one
- 3 other motor-assisted scooter and both operators are riding in a
- 4 single lane and in a manner that does not impede the normal and
- 5 reasonable movement of traffic on the roadway; or
- 6 (B) hazardous conditions make it reasonably
- 7 necessary for the operator to avoid the curb or edge of the roadway
- 8 [A county or municipality may prohibit the operation of a
- 9 motor-assisted scooter on a street, highway, or sidewalk if the
- 10 governing body of the county or municipality determines that the
- 11 prohibition is necessary in the interest of safety].
- 12 (c) A person may not operate a motor-assisted scooter at a
- 13 speed that exceeds 15 miles per hour.
- 14 (d) A person operating a motor-assisted scooter shall yield
- 15 the right-of-way to a pedestrian.
- 16 <u>(e)</u> The department may prohibit the operation of a
- 17 motor-assisted scooter on a highway if it determines that the
- 18 prohibition is necessary in the interest of safety.
- 19 [(d) A person may operate a motor-assisted scooter on a path
- 20 set aside for the exclusive operation of bicycles or on a sidewalk.
- 21 Except as otherwise provided by this section, a provision of this
- 22 title applicable to the operation of a bicycle applies to the
- 23 operation of a motor-assisted scooter.
- 24 (f) [(e)] A provision of this title applicable to a motor
- 25 vehicle does not apply to a motor-assisted scooter.
- SECTION 4. Subchapter E, Chapter 551, Transportation Code,
- 27 is amended by adding Sections 551.354 and 551.355 to read as

- 1 follows:
- Sec. 551.354. PARKING. A person may not park a
- 3 motor-assisted scooter in a manner that obstructs a roadway, path,
- 4 or sidewalk.
- 5 Sec. 551.355. EFFECT OF SUBCHAPTER ON OTHER LAW. A county
- 6 or municipality may:
- 7 (1) further restrict the speed at which a person may
- 8 operate a motor-assisted scooter;
- 9 (2) further restrict the locations a person may
- 10 operate a motor-assisted scooter;
- 11 (3) increase the minimum age requirement for the
- 12 operator of a motor-assisted scooter;
- 13 (4) impose a higher criminal or civil penalty for a
- 14 violation of this subchapter;
- 15 (5) further restrict the locations a person may park a
- 16 motor-assisted scooter;
- 17 (6) require the operator of a motor-assisted scooter
- 18 to wear a safety helmet; or
- 19 (7) prohibit the operation of a motor-assisted scooter
- 20 on a street, highway, or sidewalk if the governing body of the
- 21 county or municipality determines that the prohibition is necessary
- 22 <u>in the interest of safety.</u>
- 23 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
