5	SECTION 1. Section 110.301(c), Occupations Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	(c) This section does not apply to $\underline{:}$
8	(1) a physician whose treatment of a sex offender is
9	limited to prescribing medication to the sex offender; or
10	(2) a person who is licensed in this state to practice
11	as a physician or psychologist and has completed:

- 12 (A) at least 24 hours of training in the specific
- 13 area of sex offender assessment and treatment; and
- 14 (B) at least eight hours of continuing education
- 15 training in the specific area of sex offender assessment and
- 16 treatment during each 12-month period in which the physician or
- 17 psychologist provides sex offender treatment or acts as a sex
- 18 <u>offender treatment provider</u>.
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
