## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the eligibility of certain children for the Medicaid
- 3 and child health plan programs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 531.02444, Government Code, is amended
- 6 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (a) The executive commissioner shall develop and implement:
- 9 (1) a Medicaid buy-in program for persons with
- 10 disabilities as authorized by the Ticket to Work and Work
- 11 Incentives Improvement Act of 1999 (Pub. L. No. 106-170) or the
- 12 Balanced Budget Act of 1997 (Pub. L. No. 105-33); and
- 13 (2) <u>subject to Subsection (a-1)</u> as authorized by the
- 14 Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 (Pub. L. No. 109-171), a Medicaid
- 15 buy-in program for children with disabilities that is described by
- 16 42 U.S.C. Section 1396a(cc)(1) whose family incomes do not exceed
- 17 300 percent of the applicable federal poverty level.
- 18 <u>(a-1)</u> The executive commissioner may by rule increase the
- 19 percentage rate prescribed by Subsection (a)(2) to a rate the
- 20 <u>executive commissioner determines appropriate taking into account</u>
- 21 the income eligibility cap set under Section 32.024(1)(3), Human
- 22 Resources Code.
- SECTION 2. Section 62.101(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 24 amended to read as follows:

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- 1 (b) The executive commissioner shall establish income
- 2 eligibility levels consistent with Title XXI, Social Security Act
- 3 (42 U.S.C. Section 1397aa et seq.), as amended, and any other
- 4 applicable law or regulations, and subject to the availability of
- 5 appropriated money, so that a child who is younger than 19 years of
- 6 age and whose household income is at or below 376 [200] percent of
- 7 the federal poverty level is eligible for health benefits coverage
- 8 under the program.
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 62.102(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (b) During the sixth month following the date of initial
- 12 enrollment or reenrollment of an individual whose household income
- 13 exceeds 348 [185] percent of the federal poverty level, the
- 14 commission shall:
- 15 (1) review the individual's household income and may
- 16 use electronic technology if available and appropriate; and
- 17 (2) continue to provide coverage if the individual's
- 18 household income does not exceed the income eligibility limits
- 19 prescribed by this chapter.
- SECTION 4. Section 32.024(1), Human Resources Code, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- (1) The executive commissioner shall set the income
- 23 eligibility cap for medical assistance for:
- 24 (1) pregnant women [and infants up to age one] at not
- 25 less than 130 percent of the federal poverty guidelines;
- 26 (2) except as provided by Subdivision (3), children
- 27 under 19 years of age at not less than 250 percent of the federal

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## 1 poverty guidelines; and

- 2 (3) children under 19 years of age with a disability at
- 3 not less than 300 percent of the federal poverty guidelines.
- 4 SECTION 5. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 5 a state agency determines that an additional waiver or additional
- 6 authorization from a federal agency is necessary for implementation
- 7 of that provision, the agency affected by the provision shall
- 8 request the waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that
- 9 provision until the waiver or authorization is granted.
- 10 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
