Chapter 531, Government Code, is amended by 4 5 adding Subchapter T to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER T. IN-HOME AND FAMILY SUPPORT PROGRAM Sec. 531.801. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 7 (1) "Disability" means a physical impairment that: 8 9 (A) is likely to continue indefinitely; (B) results in substantial functional 10 limitations in one or more of the following areas of major life 11 activity as determined under the disabilities screening 12 13 instrument: 14 (i) self-care; (ii) receptive and expressive language; 15 (iii) learning; 16 (iv) mobility; 17 18 (v) self-direction; or 19 (vi) capacity for independent living; and (C) is likely to require treatment or services 20 21 that are lifelong or of extended duration. 22 (2) "Program" means the in-home and family support 23 program established under this subchapter. 24 Sec. 531.802. IN-HOME AND FAMILY SUPPORT PROGRAM. The

executive commissioner by rule shall establish the in-home and 1 family support program to provide benefits to an individual with a 2 disability that allows the individual or the legal guardian of the 3 individual to purchase items that enable the individual to reside 4 in a community-based setting. The program must be designed in 5 6 substantially the same manner as the in-home and family support program formerly administered by the former Department of Aging and 7 Disability Services under 40 T.A.C. Chapter 48, Subchapter F. 8

9 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act 10 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a 11 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, 12 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or 13 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the 14 waiver or authorization is granted.
