## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the annual salary paid to judges of county courts at law

- 3 in Travis County.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 25.2292, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (f) and adding Subsection (f-1) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (f) The judge of a county court at law shall be paid an
- 9 annual salary in an amount [that is at least] equal to an amount
- 10 that is [the salary paid district judges from the general revenue
- 11 fund of the state, but not more than] \$1,000 less than the annual
- 12 salary, including supplements, received by district judges in the
- 13 county. For purposes of determining the annual salary of a judge of
- 14 a county court at law under this section, the total annual salary
- 15 received by a district judge in the county does not include
- 16 longevity pay provided under Section 659.0445 or compensation paid
- 17 to the presiding criminal judge of Travis County under Section
- 18 75.016.
- 19 (f-1) The judge of a county court at law who receives a
- 20 salary under this section is entitled to longevity pay from the
- 21 county if the judge has completed four years of service as an active
- 22 judge, as defined by Section 74.041, in Travis County for which
- 23 credit is established in the Texas County and District Retirement
- 24 System. Longevity pay paid under this subsection is not included as

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- 1 part of the judge's annual salary for purposes of the salary
- 2 limitations provided by Subsection (f). The amount of longevity
- 3 pay paid to a judge under this subsection must be equal to the
- 4 greater of:
- 5 (1) the amount of longevity pay paid to a judge of a
- 6 district court in the county who has comparable years of service; or
- 7 (2) the amount of longevity pay paid to an employee of
- 8 the county who has comparable years of service.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
