CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Lettie England of Odessa is an outstanding community 2 leader whose achievements and tireless efforts have immeasurably

enhanced cultural life in her area; and 3

WHEREAS, From 2004 through 2010, Ms. England served 4 5 administrator of the Presidential Archives and Leadership Library, which is dedicated to the study of the office of the presidency and 6 7 of our nation's constitutional government and presidential election process; she first joined the museum staff in the 1980s as 8 9 education/marketing director, during which time she was essential to the construction of an exhibit depicting the chronology and 10 history of the United States from George Washington's presidency to 11 President Kennedy and the Civil Rights Era; she has worked 12 diligently through the years to support the institution, and her 13 leadership was especially vital following the arson fire in 2007 14 that damaged the historic home once owned by former President 15

George H. W. Bush, which stands on the museum grounds; and WHEREAS, Ms. England has also devoted herself to assisting 17 children and the elderly during her 56 years as an Odessa resident; 18 she served as president of the Austin Elementary School PTA for 19 20 three years and was appointed to the Ector County Child Welfare 21 Board and the Tri-Ethnic Committee of the Ector County Independent School District; she advocated for the young, the elderly, and the 22 23 arts both locally and statewide as a volunteer in the political 24 arena; and

- WHEREAS, A licensed social worker, Ms. England is certified 1 as a family life educator by the National Council of Family 2 3 Relations and has many years' experience as a social worker in hospice and long-term care; she served as a member of the public 4 policy committee of the Texas Association of Homes and Services for 5 the Aging; moreover, she founded the Midland Odessa chapter of the 6 Compassionate Friends support group for the bereaved; with degrees 7 8 in psychology, education, and history, she has served as a continuing education instructor at Midland and Odessa College and 9 as a guest lecturer in the sociology department of The University of 10 Texas of the Permian Basin; she has also served on the board of the 11 12 Permian Playhouse and was instrumental in obtaining a grant to 13 support the playhouse; and
- WHEREAS, Through her myriad endeavors, this dynamic Texan has made Odessa a better place to live and work, and it is indeed a pleasure to recognize her; now, therefore, be it
