HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Tardive dyskinesia (TD) is condition 2 characterized by involuntary movements of the face, trunk, or extremities, caused by long-term use of dopamine receptor-blocking 3 4 agents; and WHEREAS, A movement disorder, TD is most commonly associated 5 with facial symptoms such as uncontrolled grimacing, abnormal 6 7 motions of the lips and tongue, and rapid blinking, but may also manifest in other parts of the body; it occurs in patients who have 8 been prescribed neuroleptic medications for schizophrenia, bipolar 9

disorder, other neurological conditions, and gastrointestinal 10

11 disorders, and it can persist after individuals discontinue use of

12 the drugs; and

13 WHEREAS, Patients living with TD frequently suffer from 14 embarrassment due to their involuntary movements, which may create a sense of discomfort and unease in those around them; these 15 struggles often compound the difficulties that individuals with TD 16 already face while being treated for psychiatric and mood 17 disorders, leading them to further isolate themselves from others; 18 the condition can also make it challenging for patients to work and 19 20

stay active and productive; and 21 WHEREAS, TD is estimated to affect at least 500,000 people in the United States, and it is more prevalent among postmenopausal 22 23 women, patients over the age of 55, and those with a history of alcohol or substance abuse; it is important that patients be 24

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- 1 diagnosed as early as possible to ensure the best outcome, and at
- 2 this time, prevention remains the best-established method for
- 3 combatting the condition; and
- WHEREAS, Awareness among patients, medical professionals,
- 5 caregivers, and the public can play a crucial role in helping more
- 6 people to live lives free of TD and the challenges and stigma
- 7 associated with it, and the observance of TD Awareness Week in May
- 8 2019 will assist in promoting much-needed education on this
- 9 important health issue; now, therefore, be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the 86th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 11 hereby designate the first full week of May as TD Awareness Week and
- 12 encourage all Texans to learn more about the risk factors and signs
- 13 of tardive dyskinesia; and, be it further
- RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of Section
- 15 391.004(d), Government Code, this designation remain in effect
- 16 until the 10th anniversary of the date this resolution is finally
- 17 passed by the legislature.
