HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, On June 11, 2015, the Department of Aging and Disability Services ("DADS"), a "covered entity" under Privacy, 2 Security, and Breach Notification Rules ("HIPAA Rules"), filed a 3 breach notification report with the United States Department of 4 5 Health and Human Services, Office for Civil Rights ("OCR") stating that an impermissible disclosure of unsecured electronic protected 6 health information (ePHI) in violation of HIPAA Rules had occurred 7 when a DADS web application was accessible to unauthorized parties; 8 9 and

10 WHEREAS, On July 23, 2015, OCR notified DADS of its 11 investigation of DADS compliance with the HIPAA Rules and 12 determined that:

a. DADS failed to conduct an accurate and thorough assessment of the potential risks and vulnerabilities to the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of ePHI held by the covered entity. (See 45 C.F.R. Section 164.308(a)(1)(ii)(A))

b. DADS failed to implement appropriate technical policies and procedures for electronic information systems that maintain electronic protected health information to allow access only to those persons or software programs that have been granted access rights as specified in 45 C.F.R. Section 164.308(a)(4). (See 45 C.F.R. Section 164.312(a)(1))

c. DADS failed to implement appropriate hardware,
 software, and/or procedural mechanisms that record and examine

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1 activity in information systems that contained or used ePHI. (See 2 45 C.F.R. Section 164.312(b))

d. As a result of its failure to appropriately
4 safeguard the ePHI in a web-based application, DADS impermissibly
5 disclosed the ePHI of up to 6,617 individuals. (See 45
6 C.F.R. Section 164.502(a)); and

7 WHEREAS, OCR presented the State of Texas a Resolution 8 Agreement with Corrective Action Plan (the "Settlement Agreement") 9 in lieu of civil monetary penalties and to provide DADS an 10 opportunity to correct DADS's failures to safeguard ePHI; and

11 WHEREAS, The State of Texas has presented a counter-proposal 12 to the Settlement Agreement to OCR that applies to those covered 13 functions and information resources involved in the breach that 14 were formerly operated by DADS but that have been transferred to the 15 Health and Human Services Commission ("TX HHS"); and

16 WHEREAS, The proposed Settlement Agreement comprises the 17 following terms and conditions:

18 Payment. TX HHS agrees to pay OCR the amount of 19 \$1,600,000.00 ("Resolution Amount" or "RA").

20 Corrective Action Plan. TX HHS has entered into and agrees to comply with a Corrective Action Plan ("CAP"). If TX HHS 21 breaches the CAP, and fails to cure the breach as set forth in the 22 CAP, then TX HHS will be in breach of the Settlement Agreement and 23 24 OCR will not be subject to the release set forth in the Settlement Agreement. Compliance with the RA/CAP of the Settlement Agreement 25 26 by TX HHS is conditioned upon TX HHS obtaining the approval of, and appropriation of funds needed to comply with, the RA/CAP by the 27

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Legislature of the State of Texas. (See Texas Civil Practice and
 Remedies Code Section 111.003(b)). The term of the Corrective
 Action Plan will be three (3) years from the effective date of the
 proposed agreement.

5 Release by OCR. In consideration of and conditioned upon performance by TX HHS of its obligations under the proposed 6 Settlement Agreement, OCR releases TX HHS from any actions it may 7 8 have against TX HHS under the HIPAA Rules arising out of or related to the conduct identified in paragraph 2 of this concurrent 9 resolution. OCR does not release TX HHS from, nor waive any rights, 10 obligations, or causes of action other than those arising out of or 11 related to said conduct and referred to in this paragraph. 12

Agreement by Released Parties. TX HHS shall 13 not 14 contest the validity of its obligation to pay, nor the amount of, 15 the Resolution Amount or any other obligations agreed to under the proposed Settlement Agreement. TX HHS waives all procedural rights 16 17 granted under Section 1128A of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section 1320a-7a); and 45 C.F.R. Part 160, Subpart E; and 18 19 claims collection regulations at 45 C.F.R. Part 30, including, but not limited to, notice, hearing, and appeal with respect to the 20 21 Resolution Amount; and

22 WHEREAS, Section 111.003(a)(2), Civil Practice and Remedies 23 Code, requires the legislature to approve a settlement of a claim or 24 action against the state if the settlement commits the state to a 25 course of action that in reasonable probability will entail a 26 continuing increased expenditure of state funds over subsequent 27 state fiscal biennia; and

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1 WHEREAS, The CAP of the proposed agreement commits the State 2 of Texas to a course of action that in reasonable probability 3 entails a continuing increased expenditure of state funds over 4 subsequent state fiscal biennia; now, therefore, be it

5 RESOLVED, That the 86th Legislature of the State of Texas 6 hereby approve the proposed Settlement Agreement.
