CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, An effective way to offset the increasing cost of 2 health care is to use direct primary care for all primary health care services and use a high deductible health insurance plan in 3 combination with a health savings account to cover more expensive 4 5 care and hospitalization; and

6 WHEREAS, In direct primary care, a single low monthly fee to a 7 physician or clinic covers all primary care services, with no preexisting condition exclusions, no disagreements over covered 8 treatments, no insurance forms to fill out, and no deductibles or 9 10 co-pays; and

WHEREAS, A high deductible health insurance plan 12 combination with a health savings account is offered by the Employees Retirement System (ERS) of Texas to state employees; the 13 14 ERS notes that health savings accounts are like tax-free nest eggs for health care expenses because contributions are tax-free, up to 15 16 a certain amount set by the Internal Revenue Service; withdrawals are not taxed, as long as the money is used for qualified health 17 expenses, and interest and investment earnings are not taxed; and 18

WHEREAS, Unfortunately, Texans who enroll in a high 19 20 deductible health insurance plan in combination with a health 21 savings account cannot use their health savings account to pay for direct primary care because of an Internal Revenue Service ruling 22 23 that direct primary care constitutes a second health insurance plan, which is prohibited under federal law governing tax-free 24

- 1 contributions to a health savings account; and
- WHEREAS, Like many other states, Texas has passed legislation
- 3 to establish that direct primary care is not insurance and that a
- 4 physician providing direct primary care in return for a monthly
- 5 retainer is not subject to regulation by the Texas Department of
- 6 Insurance for the direct primary care; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Likewise, a federal regulation adopted by
- 8 the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to implement the
- 9 Affordable Care Act treats direct primary care clinics, known as
- 10 medical homes, as a health benefit, not a health insurance plan; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Despite state and federal action to clarify that
- 12 direct primary care is not insurance, congressional action is
- 13 needed to allow health savings accounts to be used for direct
- 14 primary care; such action would benefit many Texans, including
- 15 those in rural communities, by encouraging more patients to get
- 16 their care from a personal physician, rather than a hospital
- 17 emergency room, and by encouraging more physicians to practice in
- 18 direct primary care; now, therefore, be it
- 19 RESOLVED, That the 86th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 20 hereby urge Congress to allow health savings accounts to be used for
- 21 direct primary care; and, be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward official
- 23 copies of this resolution to the president of the United States, to
- 24 the president of the Senate and the speaker of the House of
- 25 Representatives of the United States Congress, and to all the
- 26 members of the Texas delegation to Congress with the request that
- 27 this resolution be entered in the Congressional Record as a
