CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, For more than 90 years, Texas Southern University
2 has played an important role in higher education in the Lone Star
3 State, and while the school currently offers baccalaureate,
4 master's, and doctoral degree programs in numerous schools, it does
5 not have a divinity program or a school of religion; now, therefore,
6 be it

7 RESOLVED, That the 86th Legislature of the State of Texas
8 hereby direct the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board to
9 conduct a study on the creation of a divinity program, from
10 undergraduate to doctoral degrees, at Texas Southern University
11 with a goal to establish a program before the start of the 87th
12 regular legislative session; and, be it further

13 RESOLVED, That the secretary of state forward an official
14 copy of this resolution to the chair of the Texas Higher Education
15 Coordinating Board.
