- 14 director from 1952 to 1994, had a great deal of influence on the

- 16 State initiatives across the country; a host of influential Texas
- 17 women were Girls State citizens, including Governor Ann Richards,
- 18 Comptroller Carole Keeton Rylander, and Judge Bea Ann Smith of the
- 19 3rd Court of Appeals; and
- 20 WHEREAS, The Bluebonnet Girls State Program has offered a
- 21 unique learning experience that has fostered civic awareness and
- 22 engagement among many of our past, present, and future leaders, and
- 23 the achievements of its alumnae have made our state even stronger
- 24 and more prosperous; now, therefore, be it
