## A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment prohibiting the taxation of
- 2 the sale or use of certain prescription medicine.
- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Article VIII, Texas Constitution, is amended by
- 5 adding Section 26 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 26. (a) The legislature may not enact a general law
- 7 that would impose a state tax on the sale or use of a prescription
- 8 medicine that was not subject to taxation under Chapter 151, Tax
- 9 Code, on January 1, 2019.
- 10 (b) This section does not prohibit the legislature from
- 11 imposing a tax on the sale or use of marijuana.
- 12 SECTION 2. The following temporary provision is added to
- 13 the Texas Constitution:
- 14 TEMPORARY PROVISION. (a) This temporary provision applies
- 15 to the constitutional amendment proposed by the 86th Legislature,
- 16 Regular Session, 2019, prohibiting the taxation of the sale or use
- 17 of certain prescription medicine.
- 18 (b) This temporary provision expires December 31, 2021.
- 19 (c) If the 86th Legislature, during the regular or a special
- 20 session, enacts a general law prohibited by Section 26, Article
- 21 VIII, of this constitution, the portion of the general law that
- 22 violates that section expires January 1, 2021.
- 23 SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 24 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 5, 2019.
